Legislative Convention Report

Department President Darlene Baker, Past National President Sandi Messenger, Life Officers, PDP's and members, I herewith submit my Department Convention Officer's Report:

I am very proud of the work the Department of New York VFW Auxiliary has done on the Legislative issues this year. I promoted the Legislative Program by reminding the members to educate, participate and get others involved.

At the June 2024 Department Convention, I included handouts in the President's packets, which were Don't feed the Sharks and the 2024 Priority Goals.

In the Department Program book, I highlighted the 60th Presidential Elections, and reminded members to vote. Additionally, I listed the Priority goals, and how to help support our Veterans through the Legislative Program as well as providing the websites to locate Senators and Congress representatives.

In the August Department Newsletter I identified the Priority goals, and requested members to take action on HR 8371 the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Health care and Benefits Improvement Act. I suggested to our members to get involved, vote, get others involved, contact your elected New York and US Representatives and Senators, and make your voices heard.

At our Officers and Members Training Session in August, I had the current Priority Goal handouts for all members and had directions on how to sign up for the Action Corps Weekly, the VFW Auxiliary involvement in Elections and Political Activities and how to Register to Vote. I did a demonstration on how to sign up for the Action Corps Weekly by walking all the members through the process of signing up for the Action Corps step by step. Members were supporting the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Health care and Benefits Act at the training session. We had 20 members report that they signed up for the Action Corps.

At the Dept of New York Fall Conference, I reminded the members to get out and Vote for the Presidential elections, be familiar with the VFW Priority goals and to participate in the VFW Action Alerts. On my table I had 2 posters displaying the VFW Action Corps, VFW 2024 Priority Goals, Don't Feed the Sharks, and your vote counts. I shared the February 17th Action Corps Weekly as it had information on the VFW Presents Education on Legislative Priorities: the house passed the Veterans Homelessness Bill and a bill to safeguard VA Benefits and Second Amendment Rights. In addition, I shared the House of Representatives who passed 7 Bipartisan Veterans Bills and the expansion of the NYS Military Museum and Veterans Research Center. Lastly, I promoted the Modernization of Electronic Gaming Bill for New York and asked our members to reach out to their Representatives and Senators to pass the Bill.

President Darlene, it has been an honor and pleasure to serve as the Department of New York's Legislative Chairman. I wish you a very successful Department and National Convention by "Soaring into the Next Century of Service with our Veterans and their Families" as "From Our Roots to our Branches, Extending Service to our Veterans."

VETERANS AND FAMILY SUPPORT CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Department President Darlene, Past National President Sandra Messenger, Past National President Jane, National District Council Member No. 4, Past Eastern Conference President Karen, Past Department Presidents, Department Line Officers, and members, it has been my honor to serve you this year and herewith submit my Department Convention report:

<u>100%</u> of our 170 Dept. of New York's Auxiliaries have participated in the great Department of New York's Veterans & Family Support Program and attained <u>100% in reporting/donating as of November 30, 2024</u>!

This year 2024-2025, it was my pleasure and honor to promote the Veterans and Family Support Program through the following strategies:

- ✓ Presented information at the June Convention in 2024 on the program for the coming year.
- ✓ Presented at the OTI in August
- ✓ Presented at the Fall Conference where we focused on Suicide Awareness and Prevention (Stop 22), "Trees for Troops" and "In Lieu of Cards."
- ✓ Presented at the Spring Conference where we focused on Operation Bottom Cover.
- ✓ Developed six Department Newsletter articles and sent out seven additional Veterans and Family Support promotions to District Presidents and FB and Department Website for distributions to all auxiliaries and members.

Again this year the program encompassed the Veterans of Foreign Wars' <u>National Veterans Service</u> (NVS), the three-part <u>Military and Veterans Support</u> (MVS) -Unmet Needs, Sports Clips Help a Hero Scholarships, and Military Assistance Program (MAP); Suicide Awareness and Prevention, the Joint Project with Department Commander Kell-VA Women's Clinic and VA Clinic Maternity Care Program and Awareness of and service to Homeless Veterans, and <u>again</u> this year, the joint project with Proctor-Hopson Post and Past Department Commander Ben Thompson, "Trees for Troops"/Holiday Cheer for holiday trees for our service members deployed overseas.

<u>NATIONAL VETERANS SERVICE (NVS) 100% of -Our auxiliaries donated.</u> The Veterans Service Officers in the VFW Dept of NY in Buffalo and New York City reported that they serve an average of new 90-140 Veterans and survivors/month; and, New York's Service officers recovered in the Buffalo Office \$76.711.59 in benefits for Veterans and dependents and in NYC office \$87.963.26 for period October 2024-present.

<u>VETERANS MILITARY AND SERVICE (VMS)</u> The National VFW reported that 95% of our Department's auxiliaries donated to UNMET NEEDS, SPORTS CLIPS HELP A HERO SCHOLARSHIPS and the MILITARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

SUICIDE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION-Again this year, The Dept of NY VFW Auxiliary collaborated with the Dept's VFW to do a STOP 22 Walk at the Fall Conference, and we encouraged our auxiliaries to hold local STOP 22 "walk" in their communities. In total, we collected donations for the VFW Department of New York in the amount of **\$9,348** and our auxiliaries submitted a total of 21 National Award #1 follow-up applications.

ACTS OF KINDNESS-. Our auxiliaries have provided goods/services, monetary assistance in total amounts of \$378,144,59 to more than 36,475 Veterans and their families, nearly double the amounts donated and veterans and families served in 2023-2024! Very special thanks to all our members for their "soaring into service" this year! "IN LIEU OF CARDS"-. Our Department donated through signatures on our giant card and especially of note was that President Darlene carried the card with her to as many District meetings as possible for members to become more acquainted with the Card and how it brings cheer to our military serving overseas at the holidays.

<u>"TREES FOR TROOPS"/HOLIDAY CHEER-</u> Our auxiliaries donated \$9,000 to send trees, menorahs and decorations to our troops serving overseas during the holidays.

In closing, I would like to thank President Darlene for appointing me to the chairmanship of Veterans and Family Support for this year. Thank you to you and all the members of our great Dept of New York for your service as we are "Soaring into the Next Century of Service with Our Veterans and Their Families" "From Our Roots to Our Branches Extending Service to Our Veterans."
