This has been an eventful year. Last year, just prior to the convening of the Department Convention, I made the decision to run for Department Guard. It was not an easy decision because I love what I do as Secretary and I knew it meant passing the appointment on to someone else.

As Department Guard, I did very little in the way of official duties. I owe great thanks and appreciation to Jeff Platt who graciously offered to serve as Guard pro tem while I completed my last year as the Secretary.

As the Membership Chairman, I wrote a program with the theme of crossing bridges because Madam President had chosen the Brooklyn Bridge as her symbol and pin. This year as we worked to meet Membership goals, we symbolically crossed major bridges in NY state. We have worked steadily toward the ultimate goal of 100%. We have already met the 100.81% PAID membership goal. This is the goal that does not penalize Auxiliaries for entering their deceased members in a timely manner as requested by the National Organization. This is the percentage Department awards are based on because it never goes down if a member passes away during the year.

However, we know the true goal is to reach 100% CURRENT memberships because that shows we are growing, finding new members to continue our mission and fill the shoes vacated by our departed Auxiliary family members. Toward that goal we are currently (as I write this) at 98.76% with just 223 members needed. With 167 Auxiliaries, that would be one member per Auxiliary, and then 56 because I know 56 Auxiliaries can find two members. I believe we can convince at least one unpaid member per Auxiliary to pay their dues before the end of June.

It is as the Department Secretary that writing this is bittersweet. I have loved four years of serving the members of the Department of NY! I have enjoyed phone calls and 50 emails per day even though they usually mean someone has a question or a problem. Talking to you all has been my privilege. I have learned what the Department President does all year and believe me it isn't just being a guest at fancy dinners and hobnobbing with National Officers. It is stressful work with stringent deadlines that she or he must meet even when you, the members, don't meet yours.

While I will pass the torch of Secretary over to highly competent hands, I know I will miss the opportunity to take your calls, receive your emails, and serve you in this capacity. I will

not be leaving the scene, however. I am running to move up the chairs as the Department Conductor and will perform my duties to the best of my ability. So, when I make the inevitable floorwork missteps, know that it is my “best”. Not perfect, but humanly my best efforts. Thank you for four years of being my Auxiliary Family and for letting me be part of yours.

Please remember that if your Auxiliary elected a new treasurer this year, form 8822-B must be filed with the IRS within 60 days. The form can be found at [IRS.GOV](https://www.irs.gov). It is a very simple form and literally takes 2 minutes to complete.

I have enjoyed this year as your Department Treasurer. I continue my efforts to be of assistance to you and broaden my knowledge of our bylaws. I strive to be as much of an asset as I can to our Department and our Officers on every level. I look forward to continuing to work with each Auxiliary and your officers.

Greetings, Department President Justine Robles, Department of New York Auxiliary Officers and Members, and Honored Guests.

Thank you, Madam President Justine, for the opportunity to serve as your 2025-2026 Department Auxiliary Outreach Chairman. I requested this program because, even though it has been widely misunderstood in past years, it can be of great value to members, auxiliaries and communities where it is active. My hope was to assist our auxiliaries and members with understanding this program's guidelines and embracing its opportunities.

I enjoyed my interactions with auxiliary leaders and members this year, throughout the Department of New York. I became acquainted or better acquainted with officers and members in our exchanges via phone, email and in person. Each of them earnestly wanted to assist their communities – and to do so in a way that would garner credit for their auxiliaries in the Auxiliary Outreach program. The variety of community organizations and volunteer activities was impressive.

Regretfully, not all attempts qualified as Auxiliary Outreach. When a reported activity did not qualify, I furnished clarification about the guidelines that were not followed and encouraged them to determine activities that would receive credit. Department President Justine Robles, Line Officers, PDP's and members, I hereby submit my Department Convention Officer's Report:

I am very proud of the work the Department of New York VFW Auxiliary has done on the Legislative issues this year. I promoted the Legislative Program by reminding the members to educate, participate and get others involved.

At the June 2025 Department Convention, I included handouts in the President's packets, which were "Don't Feed the Sharks", a copy of the 2025 Priority Goals, and how to sign up for the VFW Action Corps Weekly.

In the Department Program book, I listed the 2025 Priority Goals, and how to help support our Veterans through the Legislative Program. Websites were identified on how to locate Senators and Congress representatives for your area. Key information was listed on how to take action on the Action Alerts and to say Thank-you, as little gratitude goes a long way. Lastly, I promoted the Legislative QR code to locate additional Legislative information.

In the August Department Newsletter, I identified the Priority Goals and requested members to take action on HR 1815 VA Home Loan Program Reform Act. I suggested to our members to get involved, vote, get others involved, contact your elected New York and US Representatives and Senators, and make your voices heard.

At our Officers and Members Training Session in August, I had the current 2025 Priority Goal handouts for all members and provided hardcopy directions on how to sign up for the Action Corps Weekly. I performed a live step by step demonstration on how to sign up for the Action Corps Weekly by walking all the members through the process. We had 13 members report that they signed up for the Action Corps Weekly. For the members in attendance and those 13 new members, they were able to process the Action to support HR 1815 VA Home Loan Program Reform Act in real time.

At the Department of New York Fall Conference, I promoted the Legislative QR codes, reminded members to be familiar with the VFW Priority Goals, and to participate in the VFW Action Alerts. On my table, I had posters displaying the VFW Action Corps, VFW 2025 Priority Goals, "Don't Feed the Sharks", information, QB code business cards, and thank you cards to send gratitude. I provided the process on how to sign up for the Action Corps Weekly, as well as provided youth/student activities encouraging the legislative program with word finds, crossword puzzles, fill in the blank, songs and oaths for children of all ages.

During the January through April time frame, I provide ongoing communications and legislative status to the 11 District Presidents and District Legislative Chairmen. On January 27, 2026 I shared with the District Presidents the new 2026 Priority Goals. In addition I shared several Facebook Posts on the Department Facebook page regarding the Major Richard Star Act along with the National Ambassadors Legislative Promotion #3. On March 7th, I sent an update letting everyone know that the Major Richard Star Act did not pass.

The heart of our work in the VFW Auxiliary has always been the same: to honor, support, and uplift the Veterans who have given so much to our nation. Many of us joined this organization because we wanted to give back in a meaningful way — to say thank you, to stand beside our Veterans, and to support their families who share in their sacrifices. As we begin the new year, that commitment remains at the center of everything we do. United in purpose and driven by gratitude, we continue to find new and impactful ways to serve those who have served us.

Our focus for this year is staying **“Busy as a Bee: Working Together for Our Veterans.”** We will continue many of the successful initiatives already in place, including the ever-popular Trees for Troops program, which has made such a meaningful impact over the years. At the same time, we’ll be exploring opportunities to introduce new projects that strengthen our support for veterans and their families. As I begin another year as your chairperson, I welcome your ideas and suggestions — working together is how we make this program stronger and more effective.

Mental Health Awareness and Suicide Prevention

Sadly, many of our veterans continue to return home carrying invisible wounds — heavy hearts, difficult memories, and challenges that are not always easy to see. This year, we remain committed to raising awareness in our communities and helping to break the stigma surrounding mental health. There are many organizations we can partner with to support this effort, including the Elizabeth Dole Foundation. Your local VA Medical Center is also an excellent resource for information on programs and services available in your area.

In September (National Suicide Prevention month), we will continue to work alongside the VFW to host **“Stop 22”** events across the state. These events help bring attention to the ongoing crisis of veteran suicide, and proceeds directly support the VA’s Suicide Prevention Programs.

The **Veterans Crisis Line** remains a vital resource for veterans, their families, and friends. It is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Please continue to educate your communities about this service: **Call 988, then press 1.**

Holiday Cheer / “Trees for Troops”

We will once again be partnering with the Department VFW this year to send trees, decorations, and menorahs to our troops overseas. Each tree is \$25. Please complete the form included in the President’s Packet and return it to me by the deadline indicated.

“In Lieu of Cards”

We will again be creating a special card to accompany the trees, menorahs, and decorations sent to our troops overseas for the holiday season. This card is a meaningful reminder that our active-duty service members are not forgotten. It will be available for signatures at OMTI and Fall Conference for a donation of \$5 per signature.

National Veterans Service (NVS)

This program provides a nationwide network of nearly 300 VFW Service Officers who assist veterans and their families in navigating the VA system and obtaining the benefits they are eligible to receive. Support NVS by contributing through the Department of New York Donation Report Form found in our guidebook or on our website.

VFW Veterans and Military Support Program (VMS)

Started by the VFW, this program serves active-duty and recently discharged military members. It consists of three key components:

- **Unmet Needs:** Offers grants of up to \$1,500 to eligible veterans, service members, and military families.
