Legislation – Department Chairman, Tina Roberts is requesting all members to please remember to check the Department Auxiliary and District 8 Facebook pages. There has been a lot of Legislative information posted on them. Please share this information with your Auxiliary members. Also we have 3 Call to Action Bills which need our support. We all need to take action on these Alerts. When you take action, send a report to Tina Roberts, Legislative Chairman.

1. HR4837 - *Written Informed Consent Act* which would require clear, written information before the VA prescribes certain psychiatric medications.
2. HR 2623 - *Innovative Therapies Centers of Excellence Act of 2025* which would create five VA centers to expand access to cutting-edge PTSD treatments.
3. H.R.1965 - *Veteran Education Assistance Adjustment Act* would adjust the book stipend to \$1,400 and tie future increases to inflation, ensuring this vital benefit keeps pace with the real cost of education.

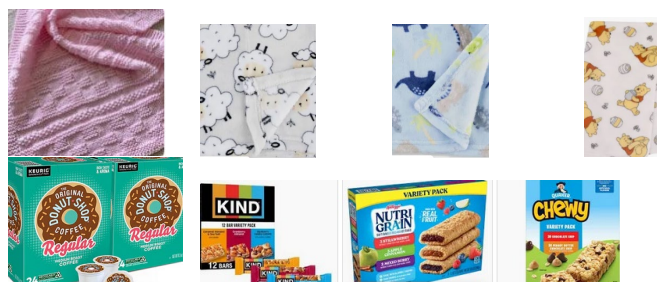

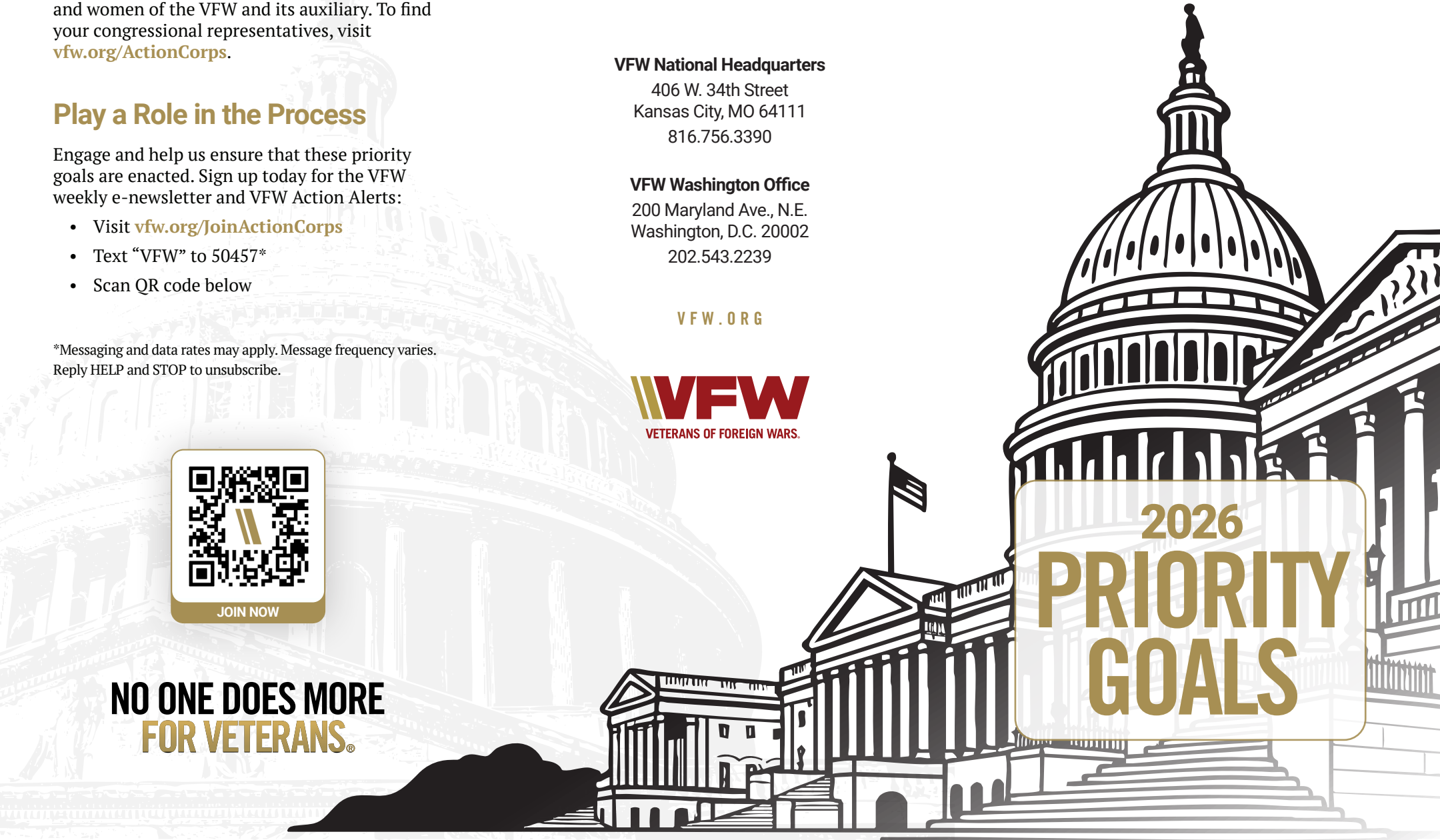

GOALS**



Budget

To fully fund relevant programs for veterans, service members and their families, Congress must:

- Hold leaders accountable to “Honor the Contract” and uphold their end of the military service contract by opposing any effort to cut or reduce veteran benefits.
- Ensure sufficient, timely appropriations and proper budget oversight for VA.
- Authorize VA to receive reimbursements from TRICARE and Medicare.
- Never reduce one veteran’s benefits to pay for another.
- Modernize and reform VA and DOD programs that do not meet the needs of service members, veterans and families.

Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs

To ensure veterans and their survivors have timely access to earned benefits, Congress and VA must:

- Implement the VFW’s recommendations to improve the VA disability claims process, specifically appeals, digital claims, DBQs and disability examinations.
- Crack down on unaccredited claims consultants known as Claim Sharks.
- Study all toxic and environmental exposures, and implement programs to ensure health care and benefits are provided to all exposed service members and veterans.
- Increase Dependency and Indemnity Compensation, burial allowances and other benefits for survivors.
- Improve the accuracy of disability compensation claims related to military sexual trauma.

Education, Employment and Transition Assistance

To ensure veterans succeed after leaving military service, Congress, VA, DOD and DOL must:

- Improve education benefits through modernized student housing and supply allowances, child care stipends, parity for National Guard and Reserve members and elimination of delimiting dates.
- Improve the delivery of the Veteran Readiness and Employment program to include administrative support for counselors and standardized training.
- Ensure parity of VA and DOD education programs with other federal programs.
- Expand small business, hiring preference, tax incentives and entrepreneurship resources for veterans and military spouses.
- Increase funding for HUD-VASH vouchers, grant and per diem payments and pilot programs to combat veteran homelessness.
- Conduct oversight of VA’s Transition Assistance Program to ensure compliance with the law, and require the inclusion of accredited claims representatives.
- Protect the VA Home Loan Guaranty program and expand it to the reserve components.
- Eliminate red tape preventing effective use of education and employment benefits.

National Security, Foreign Affairs and POW/MIA

To fully support the all-volunteer force, protect our nation’s citizens and defend American interests around the world, Congress and DOD must:

- Ensure DPAA is fully funded to perform its personnel recovery mission.
- Deter threats to our national security by supporting our allies in Ukraine, Israel, Korea and Taiwan.
- Ensure all service members who served in harm’s way—to include foreign nationals, translators and allies—receive the recognition, care and benefits they may have earned.

Health Care

To ensure service members and veterans receive timely access to high-quality health care without increasing cost shares, Congress, VA and DOD must:

- Eliminate service member and veteran suicide.
- Improve the coordination of community care at VA, including CHAMPVA and the Foreign Medical Program.
- Strengthen care and research for mental health, blast overpressure and traumatic brain injuries.
- Research the efficacy of alternative therapies for PTSD.
- Improve oversight of Vet Centers to ensure adequate staffing, resources and funding.
- Enhance programs and services for women and underserved veterans.
- Preserve the integrity of TRICARE.
- Properly implement VA and DOD health IT systems.
- Expand nursing home eligibility and long-term care options.

Military Readiness

To maintain a strong and ready all-volunteer force capable of protecting American interests, Congress and DOD must:

- Enhance quality of life and health care programs that allow service members to focus on the mission.
- Ensure equity of benefits for reserve component service members.
- End the military retirement pay and VA disability compensation offset.
- Provide benefits enrollment for all transitioning service members.
- Eliminate sexual assault and harassment from the military.
- Increase military base pay so that it is competitive with relevant civilian pay.
- Ensure that military housing and work spaces are safe and modern.
- Eliminate food insecurity in the military.



Know Your CHAIN OF COMMAND

AUXILIARY, DISTRICT, DEPARTMENT, NATIONAL

*Ten active members standing in a line,
One disliked another, and then there were nine.
Nine ambitious members offered to work late,
One felt unheard, and then there were eight...*

This poem, slightly modified from one called What's the Value of One Member (author unknown) is based on an old nursery rhyme nursery rhyme perhaps best remembered as the inspiration of the Agatha Christie novel and play "And Then There Were None." It counts down from 10 Auxiliary members as one-by-one, each becomes burned out, discouraged or mired in disagreements with the others, until there are only two left – but "One joined a bridge club and then there was one."

Most of the time, when members contact VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters with issues negatively impacting their Auxiliary, the reason is related to interpersonal conflicts either between members or growing animosity between the VFW Auxiliary and their VFW Post. Other times Headquarters hears from members, it's with questions or clarification relating to the *Bylaws*, *National Program Book* or eligibility and sometimes, these are time-sensitive. There are a number of reasons not to take these issues to a National level (which go beyond the simple believe that one "shouldn't put their business in the streets") and these include quicker response times, consideration for local customs, and, hopefully, for deescalation of potential interpersonal conflicts that can be resolved without necessitating formal disciplinary action or National involvement.

WHY KEEP IT LOCAL?

On an Auxiliary level, there are anywhere from 20 to 2,000 members, give or take, with good odds that an Officer or Past Auxiliary President will know the answer to one's question or have the skills to problem-solve otherwise, but on a National level, we have 475,000 members and a small staff, most of whom would not work directly with members on the sorts of issues or questions that typically arise. Simply put, we only have about one

staff member per hundred thousand members who could help you with these issues, which means your inquiries would potentially take a longer amount of time to reach the top of our "to do" piles.

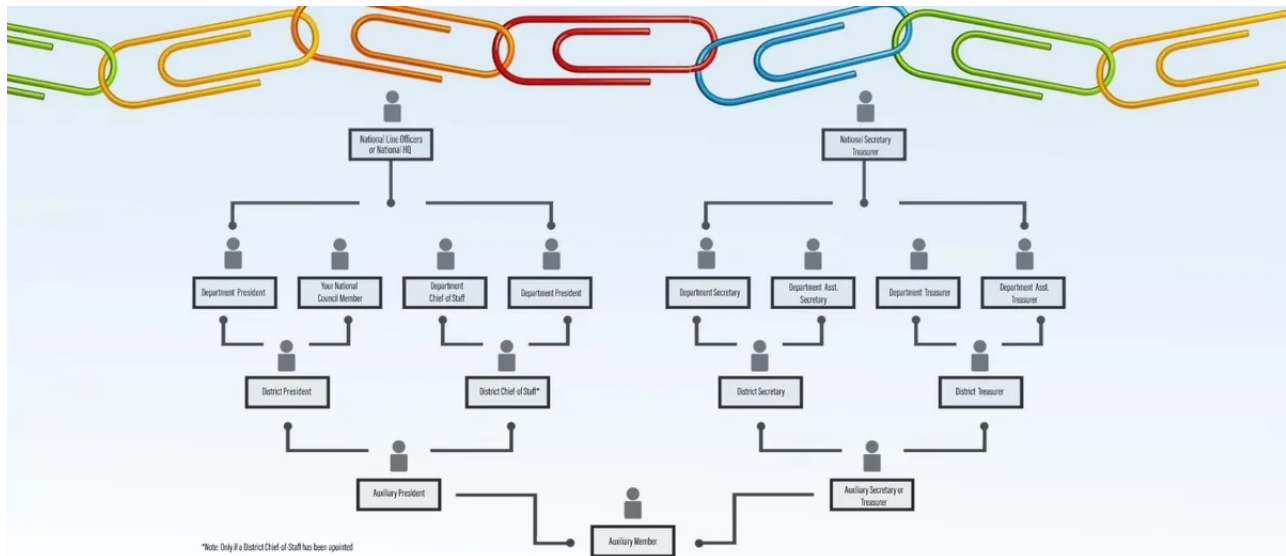
Additionally, we at National do not know the ins and outs of every Auxiliary. Some Auxiliaries prefer casual attire and round table meetings. Others prefer to dress in uniform and focus on floor work. At some, members may consider themselves family, while at others, they may be more like professional acquaintances than close friends. Your Auxiliary or District Officers are more likely to be familiar with the dynamics of your Auxiliary and be able to guide you in a more personalized way.

Lastly, many of the issues that reach National Headquarters concern interpersonal conflicts, but we find many of these could be handled at the ground level before escalation has occurred. As a diverse group with members from all different generations, cultures, political affiliations, religions, mindsets and regions, we know that we will not all agree on all things all the time - who does? But we are united in our mission to help veterans, service members, their families and our communities, even if we aren't always on the same page in regards to how. At a local level, Officers and mentors can spend the time needed to truly listen to each side of an issue and help those in disagreement come to a consensus that serves both parties and the organization as a whole. Unfortunately, once such an issue has made it all the way to the National level, it has typically become much harder to do so.

SO WHAT IS THE CHAIN OF COMMAND?

The chain of command starts with your own Auxiliary. Depending upon your question or issue, the best person to whom to address it may be the President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief of Staff, a Program Chairman or even a member you personally consider a mentor, perhaps a Past President who has been around for a long time.

If your Auxiliary President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief of Staff, etc. is unable to help, seek out the person in the



relevant position on a District level (if your Department has Districts). If they are unable to help or cannot be reached, the next level is Department, again starting with those in the aforementioned positions.

Only after the Department Officers have done their due diligence and concluded that an issue cannot be solved or a question cannot be answered should it be sent along to the National level. For many issues or questions there are potential other people to contact before reaching out to National Headquarters directly, such as your National District Council Member and/or or National Ambassadors (Program questions only).

If you have exhausted all of these options or if the question is not appropriate to ask of those in the aforementioned positions, sending an email to National Headquarters is the next step. If you contact us at info@vfwauxiliary.org and describe the question or issue, we will be able to forward it to the person best suited to help you, while sending a direct message to us on social media will only be read by our social media team, who may be able to assist if the issue is social media-related or if the answer is a simple one (for example, a link to the Patriotism Through Literacy list of recommended reads, or the date the next HQ Roundtable is scheduled), but in most cases, the social media team member will ask you to send us the inquiry as an email. Just remember, the chain of command is much like the chain of judging for National contests: local Auxiliary, District, Department, National.

HOW DO I REACH MY OFFICERS?

For members familiar with [MALTA](#), our online system (also available as a mobile app), it is easier than ever to find

contact information for those aforementioned. When looking at your Member Profile, scroll down below Dashboard and Membership/Auxiliary Information to the Officers section. Officers for your Auxiliary, District and Department will be in blue, as each is a clickable link. Once selected, a pop-up will show their position, full name, email address and phone number.

Many Auxiliaries have texting systems and frequently monitored social media pages - check with your President and Secretary at your next meeting to find out whether yours does! For those who have opted out of text message alerts and lack access to MALTA, they can also reach someone quickly by sending a message through the Post and Auxiliary's joint Facebook page. Additionally, some Auxiliaries and most Departments have their own web pages with Officer contacts, lists of upcoming events and Program information, much like the VFW Auxiliary's National website.

And then, of course, there are directories. Most Departments publish and distribute directories each Program Year just as the National organization does. These typically list the names and contact information for Auxiliary Presidents, District Presidents (if applicable), Conference Presidents, Program Chairmen, the National District Council Members, Officers and more.
