August 14th, including our VFW Department Commander Mike Hoag and several of his staff, at my homecoming in Little Valley. My sincerest appreciation goes out to both the members of the Post and the Auxiliary for their hard work and dedication for making that a day I will never forget.

On August 15^{th} , both Commander Hoag and I attended the Veterans Services at the Erie County Fair. We placed the American Flag and a rose in honor of our Veterans. It was unfortunate the parade this year was cancelled due to COVID. However, we were in the best of company surrounded by so many who were there for the same very important reason – *to pay tribute to our Veterans*.

The month of September was Military Suicide Awareness Month. The VFW and Auxiliary will be hosting a Stop 22 Walk at the Fall Conference on Saturday, October 9th. If you cannot attend the conference your Auxiliary can host a walk or event of its own in support of this vital cause. Information was included in the Fall Conference packet.

National Mental Illness Awareness Week (MIAW) is October 3 to 9, 2021. This week is marked by community education efforts in all 50 states to raise awareness about all mental illnesses. They are medical conditions that can be treated. *Help is available* for children and adults with mental illnesses including for their families. *There is hope*!

We all need to educate ourselves and others about the warning signs of suicide, not only for those who have served or active military, but for our families and friends as well. There are several resources listed in the Guidebook under Veterans & Family Support Program. Those offer options for our Veterans to obtain the services they need. One suggestion is to make brochures or flyers that can be placed in your Post home. October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Breast Cancer Awareness is as important as it has ever been. Due to COVID-19 and the pandemic, many men and women postponed annual check-ups, including breast cancer screening. While appointments were rightfully delayed, medical centers are open and they are taking steps to keep patients safe. Imaging, including mammograms, has resumed. *Now* is the time to schedule your appointment – *early detection saves lives*!

Thank you to those Auxiliaries that donated to my Special Project, National Veterans Golden Age Games. If you attend Fall Conference, be sure to spin the Carnival Wheel! Of course, the biggest winners will be our Veterans. Nearly half of our Auxiliaries donated to Health and Happiness (\$3,000). Wreaths Across America information was recently emailed announcing that Pembroke cemetery is now officially sponsored by WAA.Contact Chairman Dee Ippolito for more details.

A quick reminder that annual dues for Officers must be processed by December 31st. Chief of Staff Karen Dotson recently emailed a list of unpaid Officers to District Presidents. Please process annual Officer's dues *now*!

Auxiliary Official Visits are well underway. It will not take a lot of time and everything should go smoothly if you prepare in advance. Presidents should complete the worksheet prior to the meeting. GENERAL ORDERS # 2 ~ OCTOBER 2021 These General Orders must be read at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

1. The 2021 Fall Conference will be held October 8 and 9 at the Albany Marriott. PDP Karen Dotson is the conference chairman. The National Representative will be National District Council Member No. 4 Buttercup Baker. Advance registration, due September 30th is \$8 and registration at the door is \$10. The Council of Administration meeting will start promptly at 8:30 AM on Saturday. The Conference Business Meeting will begin immediately following the C of A meeting. Due to increased cost, the Auxiliary will not host a luncheon.

2. In accordance with National Bylaws Article V Districts Section 506—District Dues. •Delegates assembled at a District Convention may assess annual dues not to exceed 50 cents (50¢) per member per Auxiliary •Based on the June 30 membership of the preceding year. •Dues cannot be assessed per Auxiliary on a flat rate basis. •Dues should be remitted to the District Treasurer by September 30 of the current Auxiliary year or as established by the District Standing Rules.

Section 507—Quorum •The minimum number of Delegates required to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at a District meeting or Convention shall not be less than Officers and/or Delegates representing one-fourth (1/4) of the Auxiliaries of the District. •A minimum of five (5) members in good standing are required to constitute a quorum. •For the purpose of this section, the Auxiliary President shall be considered a Delegate.

3. In accordance with National Bylaws Article VIII Officers Section 809—Resignations •All resignations of Officers shall be in writing and sent to the Secretary of the body from which the Officer is resigning. •If the Secretary is resigning, the resignation shall be sent to the President of the body from which they are resigning. •Resignations are effective when issued. •Verbal resignations are binding.

Section 809A—Resignations—All Levels (Presidents & Vice-Presidents). •In the event of a vacancy in the office of the President •The Senior Vice President shall at once succeed to the title and duties of such office. •The Junior Vice President shall succeed to the title and duties of the Senior Vice President.

•Due notice of contemplated election shall be deemed given if the President announces that the election will be at the next regular meeting. •If the Senior Vice or Junior Vice-President chooses not to succeed to the next higher office, they should resign.

Section 812—Secretary, Duties of (All Levels) •The Secretary shall keep in books or files: •A record of all minutes of each meeting of the Auxiliary •The manner in which the minutes of the Auxiliary meetings are read, printed and/or distributed shall be at the discretion of the Auxiliary by vote of the membership.

Section 813—Treasurer, Duties of (All Levels) •Duties of the Treasurer are most efficiently conducted through electronic means. •The Treasurer is responsible for keeping National Headquarters up to date with bank information (i.e. account number and/or routing number). •Upon approval by the National President, the Auxiliary President may appoint an acting Treasurer when the Treasurer is unable to function for a period of time due to illness, death, resignation, or extended vacations. •The request must be in writing to the National President.

4. Auxiliaries should immediately report any change of Officer or Auxiliary information to the Department Secretary. The Auxiliary Secretaries may enter changes of member mailing/ contact information in MALTA or notify the Department Secretary. The Auxiliary Secretary may enter Death of Member in MALTA or contact the Department Secretary. Please refer to the form found on Guidebook page 55.

She is serving a two-year term as one of 29 representatives who make up the Council along with the top seven National Officers, the National Chief of Staff and the four Junior Past National Presidents.



I was notified that the Finger Lakes Healthcare System in Canandaigua has a great need for Walmart and Wegman's gift cards. If you are near this area, contact Pat Gough for further information. For those unable to volunteer at a local VA or non-VA facility, consider making lap robes, hats, quilts, cards, etc. to donate to those facilities.

With more women joining our armed forces, we need to ensure that Women Veterans receive the benefits and services to honor their commitment to our country. Examples include improved health care that identifies and treats their unique health care needs, Peer to Peer Outreach Programs and homelessness. Please advocate with your local Assembly Member, Senator or Congress Member to support such Bills as:

H.R. 958, Protecting Moms Who Served Act – This proposal will structure the VA's maternity care programs to support the needs of pregnant and postpartum veterans. Women veterans of child bearing age are among the second largest group enrolled in the VA health care system. <u>NYS Senate Bill # S4423</u> relates to Peer Support Programs to develop and establish regional and county-based peer support services programs for Women Veterans. Peer support programs help Veterans transition back to civilian life and cope with stress, depression or substance abuse.



In 1985, the first National Veterans Golden Age Games took place in Albany, Georgia, with 115 competitors representing VA medical facilities across the United States. The 2021 Games were scheduled to be held in Madison, Wisconsin from June 21 – 26, 2021, but due to Covid, the event was modified to an at-home event from May 10 - 28.

The Games are designed for veterans who are over the age of 55 and are VA patients. The goal is to help veterans make physical activity part of their daily lives, and to support the rehabilitation therapy and recreation programs offered by the VA. Participants also get the chance to build relationships with other athletes.

District Presidents, Many of you have held the first meeting of the year and school of instruction for inspectors. You should have covered the instruction sheets and importance of official visits. The Department depends on Official Visits to know if an Auxiliary is in need of assistance.

Inspectors need to be familiar with the questions on the report. After your visit, review the inspection sheet and be sure all questions are answered. Write your comments in the remarks section. The Department wants to know about any questions or problems and to learn about all the good things an Auxiliary is doing. Make sure that the CURRENT President and CURRENT Treasurer are the ONLY TWO who are signing the checks! Send all three copies of the Inspection Report to the District President within 5 to 7 days of the completion of your visit.

District Presidents, you appoint inspectors! When the forms are returned to you, review them and make sure they are complete or I will send them back to you for completion. Date the upper right-hand corner and return all copies to me within 5 to 7 days after you receive them. *PLEASE DO NOT HOLD INSPECTIONS UNTIL YOU HAVE SEVERAL TO SEND AT ONCE.*

If an appointed inspector is not able to complete an Official Visit, they should return all materials to the District President who will then appoint a new inspector.


"FUND THE FUTURE" - VFW Auxiliary Scholarships

Facebook Tips for An Active and Awesome Auxiliary Page

Not all social media platforms are created equal. Facebook is a must – especially if your Auxiliary or District does not have its own website! Social media experts suggest you post AT LEAST once or twice per day to Facebook. How do you have time for that? How do you come up with that much stuff to post? It can seem overwhelming, especially with all of your other responsibilities and duties! Listed are best practices and helpful tips to help you generate content and keep your Auxiliary or District Facebook page active and awesome!

• Assign two or three people in your Auxiliary or District to be Administrator of the Facebook page (President, Sr. Vice, Jr. Vice, Secretary, Historian, a social media savvy member, etc.) • Upload a great Cover Photo and Profile Picture. A Cover Photo is horizontal (across); choose one that was originally horizontal. A Profile Picture is square; choose one that was originally square. • Review the "About" section. Does the contact information need to be updated? Address, phone number, email address of Post, Auxiliary or District. (Do not post your personal contact information.) • Review the Company Overview Story. • Know the Facebook URL (web address) for your Auxiliary, District or Department. For example, the url for Auxiliary National Headquarters is: https://www.facebook.com/VFWAuxiliary.

Tip: Add the Facebook web address to all communications. Include a hyperlink in your email signature; list it in newsletters, promotions, dues notices, etc. • Have a Plan! Think about everything that will be going on in the next three months. Develop a plan/schedule and post events, meetings, etc. on a calendar so your members can see what's coming up. Schedule Facebook posts in advance on your Auxiliary or District page to save time.

What to Post?: Stories about how members/Auxiliaries in our Department are making a difference in our community and the lives of veterans and their families. Include Member of the Week/Month, Question/Conversation starters, ask for members' opinions or to share their own member experience, • Event promotion; photos of events that took place; links to Department forms, program guidebook, etc. Share posts from •VFW Headquarters, Auxiliary Headquarters and/or • VFW National Home for Children.

In review, maintaining an active and awesome Auxiliary Facebook page can seem overwhelming. By having multiple administrators and developing a plan and scheduling posts in advance will help this method of communication and publicity become easier.
