

Dear members, As I write my last Hospital Program newsletter article for this year, I am thinking about how far we have come. Many of our VA hospitals and clinics are still closed because of COVID. But, many of our non-VA hospitals and nursing homes are opening up again and we are beginning to start to do what we all love to do for our Veterans – volunteer and help and care for them!

Even though you will not receive this until after our June Convention, I would like to advise you of something that my Ambassador shared the first stanza of this poem with us:

"BIVOUAC OF THE DEAD" by Theodore O'Hara
"The muffled drum's sad roll has beat
The soldier's last tattoo;
No more on life's parade shall meet
That brave and fallen few.
On Fame's eternal camping-ground
Their silent tents are spread,
And Glory guards, with solemn round,
The bivouac of the dead."

Memorial Day, May 30, 2022, has passed by this year. However, I want to write a little bit about the Flower of Remembrance. "In Flanders Fields" was written by WWI Colonel John McCrae, a surgeon with Canada's First Brigade Artillery. He expressed his "grief over the row on row of graves of soldiers who died on Flanders' battlefield, located in a region of western Belgium and Northern France.
