## GENERAL ORDERS # 1 ~ AUGUST 2022 – (Must be read at the FIRST meeting following receipt before being filed.)

- 1. Having been duly elected by acclamation and installed as Department President at the 97<sup>th</sup> annual convention held June 8-11, 2022 at the Marriott Hotel in Albany, NY, and working in accordance with the Bylaws and Ritual of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Auxiliary, I, Lisa Raplee, hereby assume command of the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York. All previous Having appointments are declared null and void and the new officers and chairmen assignments are now in effect.
- **2.** Official communications intended for the Department President shall be addressed to: Lisa Raplee at:

4259 State Route 226, Dundee, NY 14837

- **3.** Requests for rulings shall come through the VFW Auxiliary Secretary, by order of the VFW Auxiliary President, and shall bear the VFW Auxiliary seal. All requests must be in writing and addressed to the Department President who shall forward the request for a ruling to the National president.
- **4.** The official headquarters for the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York is hereby declared to be located at:

1799 Fred Road, Schenectady, NY 12303

All mail intended for the Department Secretary should be addressed to: Christine Leavor, 2027 Cemetery Hill Rd., Franklinville, NY 14737

**5.** Checks intended for the Department of New York VFW Auxiliary shall be payable to "VFW Auxiliary Department of New York (VFW Aux DNY)" earmarked for the fund intended. Checks for Department business should be mailed to:

Department Treasurer, Kim White, 1799 Fred Road, Schenectady, NY 12303

Checks for specific projects or fundraisers should be mailed to the Program Chairman unless otherwise specified.

- **6.** The VFW Auxiliary President shall countersign all checks drawn by the Treasurer. VFW Auxiliaries may not possess ATM (Automatic Teller Machine) cards, and/or debit or credit cards. The disbursement of money shall be upon motion made and passed at a meeting with the exception of the transmittal of membership dues, which does not require a motion. Refer to Sec. 801A- Auxiliary President of the current Bylaws.
- 7. VFW Auxiliaries are reminded of the suggested donation of \$2.00 per member to the Cancer Grant Fund based on Auxiliary membership quota as of June 30, 3022.
- **8.** VFW Auxiliaries are encouraged to donate a minimum of \$0.10 (10 cents) per member for the VFW National Home for Children "Health and Happiness" based on the June 30, 2022 membership quota. Treasurers may process this donation directly through MALTA or mail a check made payable to "VFW Auxiliary" earmarked *Health & Happiness*" directly to: VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters, 406 West 34<sup>th</sup> St., 10<sup>th</sup> Floor, Kansas City, MO 64111.

- **9.** Inspectors are required to attend a School of Instruction held in their respective District. Official visits (on all levels) are to be completed by **December15**, **2022**.
- 10. It shall be the duty of the Trustees to ensure that the offices of the VFW Auxiliary President and Treasurer are bonded with an indemnity company authorized by the National Headquarters or the Department as surety in a sum at least double the amount of funds and value of property for which, so far as can be anticipated, the VFW Auxiliary President and Treasurer may be accountable. Refer to Sec. 814-Trustees, Duties of (All Levels) of the current Bylaws.
- 11. The President shall hold the original bond for both the President and Treasurer. A copy of the President and Treasurer bonds shall be incorporated into the Minutes book.
- **12.** Per VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters: There is no minimum age requirement for the bond to cover an officer. If a loss occurs, the bonding company may legally pursue indemnity against the person regardless of age. Therefore, any member in good standing is eligible to hold the office of President or Treasurer.
- 13. Presidents on all levels shall, within thirty (30) calendar days of assuming office, submit to the Commander of the corresponding VFW unit a financial report and membership count of their Auxiliary. Refer to Sec. 810- President, Duties of (All Levels) of the current Bylaws.
- **14.** Auxiliary Treasurers shall, upon the death of an Auxiliary member, immediately enter the name and date of death in MALTA or send the information to the Department Secretary.
- 15. It shall be the duty of the Auxiliary Trustees to properly audit the books and records of the Treasurer and Secretary no later than thirty (30) days following the expiration of each quarterly period. Refer to Sec. 814- Trustees, Duties (All Levels) of the current Bylaws. Quarterly Audit report forms must be received by the Department Treasurer no later than sixty (60) days following the end of each quarter as follows: August 31st (April 1-Jun 30); November 30<sup>th</sup> (July 1- Sept. 30); February 28<sup>th</sup> (Oct 1- Dec. 31); May 31<sup>st</sup> (Jan. 1- Mar. 31, 2023). The quarterly Audit report form should be submitted to the Department Treasurer, Kim White, by USPS mail or scanned and emailed only. The Audit report form may not be sent via text message.
- **16.** Auxiliaries should submit the 2022-2023 Donation Report Form by September 30, 2022 to the Department Treasurer.
- 17. All Department correspondence to the Auxiliaries is to be sent to the Auxiliary President. The Auxiliary President is an elected officer and is responsible for seeing that the correspondence is properly complied with. He/She has the authority to act on the correspondence if it is something that must be taken care of before her/his next Auxiliary meeting.

## Educate ~ Participate ~ Get Others Involved

Our voice on Capitol Hill cannot be ignored given our strength of more than 1.5 million members of the VFW and the Auxiliary. Some of the recent and most important legislative victories were the expansion of college education benefits for military service members with the signing of the **Forever GI Bill**; and, ensuring America's service members and veterans receive the care of their choice that they deserve by passing the **VA MISSION Act**.

Our first Primary election in New York State took place in June, selecting candidates for Assembly and statewide offices. The second Primary election, taking place in August as a result of the redistricting process, selects candidates for congressional and state Senate offices. The general election will be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

All members are encouraged to participate in local and grassroots efforts to Get Out The Vote (GOTV). After logging into MALTA, resources are available under the subject "Legislative" at the Auxiliary website (www.auxiliary.org/resources), including the "do's and don'ts" for involvement in elections and political events. VFW Auxiliary members are also encouraged to get involved in elections, hold voter registration drives, and help facilitate Town Hall meetings and other events featuring candidates for public office. This shows that veterans and those who support veterans issues to be a strong group of voters that most candidates seek support from.

Several reports have been received from Districts and I look forward to receiving more reports of legislative activities our members have been involved with.

For the past several years the Department of New York has assisted Wreaths Across America in distributing wreaths on graves of those deceased Veterans in National Cemeteries on the third Sunday of December. For \$15, one wreath will be placed on a grave in a National Cemetery of your choice. Donate \$30 and receive three wreaths. All three wreath must go to the same cemetery. Send order form with your check to me or bring it to Fall Conference.

Let's make sure that American Flag is flying proudly. The Department of New York is offering your Auxiliary a free 3X5 American Flag (request form found in Presidents Packet or by contacting me.) The only requirement is that it be given to a non-profit organization that benefits Veterans or Youth.

Yes, **#Auxilarypatriotism** is back...report when you use the hashtag on social media i.e. Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc.

Lastly, I know you all do great things for our Veterans, their families and our communities. Please report what you have done! Flag Day? Memorial Day? July 4<sup>th</sup>? Did you pass out flags, help your Post, or participate in parades? Host a Patriotic Community Event to be eligible for Department Awards. Remember it is the quality of the report, not necessarily the quantity of reports that brings home awards and shows your community your Patriotic Pride.

## Let's Talk about Fact Sheets!

Fact Sheets are a powerful way to communicate the results of your work directly to the public. These concise official publications can be particularly useful in helping readers understand and appreciate your efforts. Fact Sheets also increase public awareness of the VFW Auxiliary and our mission. An effective Fact Sheet should be a tool in every Auxiliary's toolbox. Refer to it at a recruiting event, a Family Freedom Festival, or when speaking to the community about your accomplishments. There is one available on the National Website that is tailored to the National Organization as a whole, but how about recreating one specifically about your Auxiliary?

No matter how well written, a Fact Sheet will not convey its message unless it is picked up and read. An attractive, color Fact Sheet is far more likely to be noticed than a plain-looking black-and-white product. Colorful illustrations, an interesting format and a bold title help capture the viewer's attention at a quick glance.

**TEAMWORK**—Every phrase in a Fact Sheet must be carefully considered to ensure that it can be clearly understood, cannot be misread and conveys no unintended meanings to the non-VFW Auxiliary reader.

**REVIEW**—Different eyes see different things, so you can hardly have too many people read/review a Fact Sheet. **COLOR! COLOR! COLOR!** —Tasteful and effective use of color makes it more likely that the general public will pick up a publication and read it.

"SPEAK PLAINLY"—Intended for the public, Fact Sheets must be easily understood by a broad audience.

**CONCISENESS**—Ask yourself, "Will the public really care about this?" If the answer is "No," either delete this particular item or, if it is essential to the story, make it relevant.

**POINT OF CONTACT**—So that the interested reader can get more information on the topic presented, a point of contact should be given at the end of your Fact Sheet. Include a telephone number, mailing address, and email and (or) website address.

Creating an effective Fact Sheet for the general public may involve many revisions and much teamwork. Every aspect of a Fact Sheet must be carefully considered to ensure that it will be clearly understood by the non-VFW Auxiliary reader.

We know we all need an extra push at times to race ahead with new ideas each year. I know there are many of us that need to regenerate our Auxiliaries, Councils and Districts. What you do on all these levels flows over to our Department level. I'm here to help you. There are many articles on Malta that will assist you and I bring our Department and our Department President Lisa to new heights.

The first thing I would like you to do to help yourself is to go onto Malta and create a log in if you have not already done so. Then you go to Resources and you will find a multitude of education material for all programs. The Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit has seven ways to assist Auxiliaries in identifying and solving issues.

- 1. Healthy Auxiliary Checklist
- 2. Healthy Auxiliary Member Questionnaire
- 3. Auxiliary Meeting Clinic
- 4. Communication Phone/Test Tree

- 5. Good Job Certificate
- 6. Healthy Auxiliary Certificate
- 7. VFW Auxiliary Mentoring Guide

Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation will educate our members in all aspects of Officer Duties and how to be a chairman. We want each and every one of our members to feel free to race ahead of each other and assist our Veterans in all their needs.

The Five (5) Essentials of an Auxiliary are also helpful to all our Auxiliaries within the Department. These can help our Auxiliaries that are successfully operating and also those in need of assistance.

- 1. Auxiliaries should have at least ten (10) business meetings per year. (Sec. 210) Five (5) members in good standing (of that Auxiliary) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. (Sec. 212).
- 2. Dues should be paid by at least ten (10) members on or before February 1 of the current year. (Sec. 207)
- 3. Quarterly Audits by Trustees must be submitted. (Sec. 814).
- 4. Officers elected, installed and reported to National Headquarters no later than June 30. This generates the bond application via email. (sec. 804A and 806A).
- 5. The offices of President and Treasurer MUST be bonded by August 31.

We are all here to take an active part in revitalizing our auxiliaries. I'm here to assist you in any manner I can. Please contact me either by telephone at 315-286-2683 or email at mari.mclane1@ gmail.com.

District Presidents, the forms are to be returned to you within 7 days of an inspection. Go over each inspection to see all questions are answered and sign in the upper right hand corner and return to me within a week of you receiving them. **DO NOT HOLD INSPECTIONS UNTIL YOU HAVE SEVERAL.**

Orders received by Sep 23 can be picked up at the Fall Conference. Prices are Sm -Xlg (\$12) and 2X-4X (\$16). Sweatshirts of the same sizes are \$28.00 /\$32.00. All funds raised will be going to each VA facility for the Homeless Project Program. A \$50 citation will be awarded at the June Convention for the most unique "Fundraiser" to promote the shirt sales.

About the Project: Veterans once stationed in Japan may recall hearing the term "omakase" while dining at local restaurants. Rooted in the verb "to trust," diners who order "omakase" leave their entrée to the chef's discretion—trusting they are the experts on their ingredients and talents. Within <u>VA's Grant and Per Diem Program (GPD)</u>, the concept behind "omakase" is central to reducing long-term homelessness among Veterans.

The GPD Program funds community agencies providing transitional housing and other services to Veterans experiencing or at imminent risk of homelessness. Much like chefs, GPD grantees know which ingredients—or program elements—mix and match to create a recipe for success.

Similarly, VA trusts that both grantees and Veterans participating in GPD are the experts on their own needs; GPD case managers help Veterans choose the path that best aligns with their goals. The synergistic relationship between GPD and Veterans has helped hundreds of thousands of Veterans exit homelessness since GPD's 1994 pilot program.

While our nation—and the landscape shaping Veteran homelessness—has changed dramatically in the past 2 decades, GPD's progress toward ending Veteran homelessness remains constant. If you would like more information, please visit <a href="https://www.va.gov/homeless">www.va.gov/homeless</a>.

"There is always now." You don't have to wait until the next meeting. Start your research and gather information "now." Surf the various virtual media sites or review grocery, pharmacy, church and post office bulletin boards, or the yellow pages to find groups that are looking for volunteers. A few examples are non-profit charities like the Red Cross, food pantries, low-income and senior assistance centers, homeless and animal shelters, libraries, maintenance departments that maintain parks and hiking trails, and/or environmental improvement organizations.

The exciting news for 2022-2023 is that events and/or activities held at the Post or the Auxiliary meeting location **CAN** be reported as Auxiliary Outreach **IF** members are the supporting "partner," only volunteering hours. The Auxiliary or VFW **CANNOT** be the organizer or promoter. Additional guidelines are available in National President Jane Reape's and Department President Lisa Raplee's Guidebooks. The goal of the Auxiliary Outreach Program is to enable Auxiliaries and their members to report volunteer hours that **CANNOT** be reported under other Auxiliary Programs. "Robbing Peter to pay Paul" doesn't gain the Auxiliary extra reportable hours.

Auxiliary Outreach is a "multi-step" program. "Partnering" to volunteer is only one (1) of the steps in the process. At Auxiliary meetings be prepared to present your project ideas so motions can be approved and recorded in the minutes for Auxiliary members to "partner to volunteer hours." Motions must be organization specific but can be for a single or various events; i.e.: I move the members volunteer with XYZ Inc. to serve meals every other month this year while wearing Auxiliary apparel or other items that make them easily identifiable as Auxiliary members.

As members continue to be "United to Win the Race for Our Veterans and Their Families," Auxiliary Outreach projects and members volunteering hours in their communities prove that members have "Hands that Serve, Hearts that Care."
