At the time this is written, our 118th Congress awaits to be sworn in and seated. The legislative agenda and committee hearings should soon be moving forward. We anticipate legislation affecting our Veterans, activeduty service members, and their families, will be addressed.

Our work remains undone. We must continue to lobby and educate our elected representatives on the need to swiftly pass legislation that has languished in committees for far too long. These legislative measures include:

- Expand geriatric extended care services, nursing home eligibility, and long-term care options.
- Improve VA's prescribing and deprescribing practices.
- Improve programs and services for women and minority veterans.
- Eliminate copayment requirements for preventive health care, including medications.
- Research the efficacy of medical cannabis.
- Properly implement VA and DOD health IT systems.
- Ensure Affordable Care Act parity and access for VA and TRICARE users.

All members are encouraged to continue lobbying their elected representatives by phone, email, and US mail. Together, our voices can effect change. Many legislative reports have been received from Auxiliaries throughout the State. I look forward to receiving more reports about the legislative activities our members have been doing.

Greetings to my Auxiliary Family!

There have been many officer changes this year, and many have been appointed as a new secretary mid-way through the year. I certainly STRONGLY recommend that all new officers plan to attend next year's OTI. In the meantime, I have included some of the duties of an Auxiliary Secretary. In the next edition, I will include others that you will have regarding the election of officers in April.

- ✓ Auxiliary Secretary (Refer to Sec. 812) 1. MALTA If you have not already done so, activate your MALTA account by going to vfwauxiliary.org and click on MALTA Member Login. You will need your membership ID number, which can be found on your membership card.
- ✓ Keep a proper record of the minutes of each meeting: Be sure all expenditure of funds are voted at your meeting. Include the motion, who made it, and who seconded it, as well as whether the motion was approved in your meeting minutes.
 - Treasurer's report and audit reports must be incorporated in the minutes. This means they are part of the minutes- not filed separately somewhere.
 - Copy of President's and Treasurer's bonds shall be incorporated into the minutes each year.
- ✓ The way the minutes of the Auxiliary meetings are read, printed and/or distributed shall be at the discretion of the Auxiliary by vote of the membership. Consideration should be given to the cost of printing when voting. (Refer to Sec. 812).
- ✓ Maintain a roll of deceased members with the date of death. (Refer to Sec. 812A).

I also need to again remind you that when you have an officer change, I need to receive the officer change form completely filled out. The form is on page 53 of the Guidebook. Please use the most recent form. I have received one that was used in 2008! The requested information is not the same and the addresses to send it are very different. If your secretary has already entered the change in MALTA, just indicate it on the form. Note: When there is a change in Treasurer, I need to send the form to National after I record it in our records. Only National can make that change in MALTA.

I look forward to seeing many of you at Spring Conference. Please introduce yourself if you see me around. I have spoken to many on the phone and would love to have a face to associate with the name.

As always, I remain at your service - my contact info is in the Directory, the Guidebook, and on the front page of this newsletter.

The VFW Auxiliary has been advocating for female combat veterans' healthcare since 2013. It has been slow progress but most VA Hospitals have made significant strides in meeting the needs of our female veterans and service members. Here are a few ideas to consider:

- 1. Hosting a baby shower at a VA facility. Since many VA's are still closed to volunteers here in NY, your event could be held outside in the warmer weather or have a "Drive Through" baby shower.
- 2. Provide feminine items, such as shampoo and conditioner, skin lotions, pads, tampons, powders, etc. Please check with the Hospital or your local VAVS Rep.
- 3. Donate items of clothing for female veterans. Soft nightgowns or pajamas would be most welcomed. Again check with your local VA Rep.

My thanks to all of you who have supported the Scholarships Program so far this year. We are so close to 100% in reporting. If you have reviewed the Program Report by Irene Rohde and noticed that an Auxiliary in your area has not yet received credit, please reach out to them and encourage them to send me a report.

Student submission deadlines for both the Young American Creative Patriotic Art and 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art are identical at all levels. Judging and Auxiliary deadlines, eligibility, rules, and judging criteria remain unchanged. If a student enters both contests in the same year, two entry forms must be completed (one for each contest). Visit vfwauxiliary.org/scholarships to find it. The 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest has its own scholarship amounts. Entries are judged on patriotic theme, creativity, and technique. Digital art, photography, and jewelry are not accepted. **Important to Note:** There will no longer be a District judging level for either art scholarship contest. Winning entries advance from the Auxiliary level to the Department to National. Entries must be received at the Auxiliary level by March 31st for judging and at the Department level by April 15th so the winning entries can be received at VFW Auxiliary Headquarters by May 5th.

The Scholarships Program is a wonderful way to introduce youth, our communities, and potential members to the VFW and VFW Auxiliary. We must remember to recognize all of our local participants. From the students to the teachers, parents, members, judges, and local media everyone likes to be acknowledged for their efforts. You will find everything you need to make our contests a huge success at vfwauxiliary.org/resources.

That being said, you must pay your dues to enter your next auxiliary meeting. If your dues remain unpaid and should you need a cancer grant, you will not be eligible for that benefit.

With six [6] months left of the Auxiliary year, we stress the importance of now paying your dues. That is why the New Year is for renewal. We need each and every one of you to please pay your dues now. Our membership is where our voices are heard for our Veterans. Sampson Veterans Memorial Cemetery - A Special Place

The history of the Sampson Veterans Memorial Cemetery dates back to WWII, when a base was built on the land. It was used to train navy recruits, but became a separation station towards the end of the war. After that it became a temporary veteran's college. When the Korean War broke out, Sampson returned to active duty as an Air Force Base. Eventually, the base closed in 2000. They put aside 2000 acres for what is now known as Sampson State Park, leaving 162 acres for a cemetery. It was the determination of several Navy and Air Force Veterans, that it became a Veterans Cemetery on Sep 5, 2008. The first burial was Sep 26, 2011.

During the stop at the cemetery for Jane's visit, the group received a briefing in the chapel from Cemetery Director William Yale. The stained glass windows in the chapel were a special project of PDP Cindy Campbell, and it was a touching moment to see the results of Cindy and the Department of NY VFW Auxiliary's efforts.
