

NATIONAL SPECIAL ORDER # 177 ~ FEBRUARY 15, 2023 Cancellation Putnam County Council-68 ~ New York

The Charter of VFW Putman County Council, Department of New York was cancelled and declared defunct by recommendation of the Department Commander and in accordance with the provisions of the National VFW Bylaws and VFW Special Order No. 176, dated January 11, 2023; therefore,

1. VFW Auxiliary to Putman County Council-68, Department of New York is hereby cancelled and dropped from the rolls of the National Organization as of <u>April 1, 2023</u>, which is at least sixty (60) days from the date of this notification for the Putman County Council Auxiliary to finalize its business.

The following procedures are to be followed:

1. The property of the County Council including books of record, papers, and all moneys belonging to it, shall be turned over within 30 days to the Department President or his/her Representative for disposition as directed by the Department Council of Administration.

2. The Department President shall forward the Charter to National Headquarters.

The Department President will see that this order is executed immediately.

Hello, again, my Auxiliary Family!

In the Feb/Mar edition of the Auxiliary News I shared from the bylaws Sec 812 <u>some</u> of the responsibilities of an Auxiliary Secretary. This month I continue to discuss the role of the Auxiliary Secretary.

* For example- you may still be writing the minutes in the black Secretary ledger book that can be ordered from the VFW Store. That's fine. Or, you might be typing the minutes and then fastening them in the previously mentioned black bound book. That's fine as well. However, be aware that if you are fastening the minutes in the book, or putting typed minutes in a three-ring notebook, these pages must each be numbered consecutively- and initialed by the Trustees at audit. (pg. 78 of the Podium Book.)

* <u>All</u> communications from National, or Department Officers are official and shall be read at a meeting before being filed for reference. (This includes the Auxiliary News. The President's letter is an official communication to be read every edition- as well as share with your chairmen the chairmen's articles. Emails are ALSO communications. They should be read as well.)

* The Secretary notifies orally or in writing all newly elected members.

With Auxiliary elections taking place in April, the following Secretary duties are worth noting:

* Enter the information required from the Installation Report in MALTA, or submit the installation report to the Department Secretary for entry into MALTA within seven (7) calendar days.

* Input or transmit the names of the Delegates and Alternates to the Secretaries required to receive them within thirty (30) days of election. This means District delegates/alternates to the District Secretary, Department delegates/ alternates to the Department Secretary, and National delegates/ alternates to the National Secretary-Treasurer. The names/addresses are on the forms I mailed to each Auxiliary President. I remind you that the Election form must be returned to me-even if you, as the Secretary, have already entered the officers into MALTA. I use that information to compile the 2023-2024 Directory. I also remind you that the May Department ZOOM session will be about completing and returning these forms. I know most of you will have already sent them by that time, but I will be looking at them to address the most common mistakes we are making. I recommend the Secretary make copies of all election materials and keep them in the records.

I hope you were able to attend the Spring Conference and found it enjoyable as well as informative. See you in June at the Department Convention!

Our 118th Congress is a house divided, with one party in control of the House of Representatives and the other party in control of the Senate. We need to remain focused. Our organization must continue to lobby and educate our elected representatives on the need to swiftly pass legislation intended to benefit Veterans, active-duty service members, and their families.

Pending legislation are Bills that have been brought to the floor and read into the minutes, then forwarded to the appropriate Committee for discussion and review before coming back to the floor for a vote. Examples of legislation languishing in committee may be found at the website for Veterans Affairs, https://www.veterans.senate.gov/legislation.

- Bill number S. 622 -to improve services provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs to Veteran families.
- Bill number S. 449 -to improve the assignment of patient advocates at medical facilities of the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- Bill number S. 280 -to ensure that only licensed health care professionals furnish disability examinations under a certain Department of Veterans Affairs pilot program for use of contract physicians for disability examinations, and for other purposes.
- Bill number S. 141 -to improve certain programs of the Department of Veterans Affairs for home and community-based services for veterans, and for other purposes.

Writing to, calling, and lobbying our elected representatives is the most effective way to ensure our voices are heard. Together, our combined voices can result in positive change. Keep sending your legislative reports. I look forward to reading your reports about the legislative activities our members have been involved with.

How Landlords Can Help End Veteran Homeless

No individual who served their country should be without a home. VA cannot address this alone and needs landlords who are interested in housing these Veterans. In this historic crisis, landlords have a unique opportunity to give back to those who have served. Veterans have selflessly defended our nation in times of need — and landlords can make a positive impact by protecting these individuals from the risk of homelessness. Housing Veterans doesn't just provide shelter, but can lead to life-changing health, social, and socioeconomic outcomes for them and their families. Furthermore, housing Veterans provides a mutually beneficial relationship; landlords will benefit from responsible, often long-term, renters, support from VA, and guaranteed payments that come through Housing Choice Vouchers or grantees offering short-term subsidies.

Benefits to Renting to a Veteran:

- **Reliable income** With HUD-VASH vouchers and SSVF subsidies, a portion of the rent is automatically paid on time to landlords by a public housing authority or an SSVF provider. A team supports the Veteran to provide stability, educates the Veteran on his or her tenancy requirements, and helps the Veteran meet the requirements of the lease. In addition, the combination of these payments along with the Veteran's portion matches fair market rental prices, so landlords won't see less money coming in.
- Support from VA Case management from VA support programs can connect landlords and Veterans with help they may need; thus, leading to more successful and stable tenancy.
- Serve those who have served- Landlords renting to Veterans can feel proud of their decision to house those who have answered our nation's call. Such a decision can be consequential in changing a Veteran's life.
- **Support community health outcomes-** The pandemic reminds us that nearly all health is public, and our wellbeing is highly influenced by the health of our community. Veterans experiencing homelessness are at higher risk of contracting COVID-19 as well as developing other health conditions. By providing safe housing to Veterans and their families, landlords can help mitigate these risks, improve community health, and help our nation make progress in recovering from this national tragedy.

Make sure that your Auxiliary is taking advantage of the VFW Auxiliary Publicity Guide: • Proven methods of generating publicity • What Auxiliary activities and events are newsworthy? • What is the format for a news/press/media release? • A template for creating your own local fact sheet • Sample News Release • TV & Radio Public Service Announcement samples • Sample media interview with questions and answers. Press/media releases are a great way to get the word out about Auxiliary functions and what we are all about. Less is more! A few helpful hints include: • Your release should not exceed one page; and never be more than one and half pages! The reason for this is reporters scan most press releases. • Make sure you include all the important who's, what's, where's, when's and why's. Carefully proofread; use

• Make sure you include all the important who's, what's, where's, when's and why's. Carefully proofread; use spell check; and then ask a friend to look!

• Always provide relevant links to your website or Facebook page, a copy of the National Fact Sheet and the National Elevator Speech where writers can learn more about your mission and what you've accomplished. • Is this a story and a photo opportunity? If so, include a line at the top: Photo opportunity: then explain it!
