- NEW Treasurers should file IRS form 8822b within 60 days of election.

- September 30<sup>th</sup> Donation Report forms are due.
- December 15<sup>th</sup> All Official visits must be completed.

Hashtag Edition #

The key point of the Historian & Media Relations Program is to publicize/capture/preserve your Auxiliary's story so you can share it with your community. One way to publicize and promote your Auxiliary is to use hashtags when you post something to a social media platform like Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter. Using hashtags makes it easier to find things you post and share online. More importantly, it makes it easier for others to find what you have posted. Use them like signposts to direct the viewing public to your photos, flyers, and announcements. You can create a hashtag when you pair up the pound sign / the number symbol (#) with a word or words used for describing a topic or theme – with no spaces. If you use a smartphone, mobile device, laptop, or a computer, you can do it. For example, The Department of New York VFW Auxiliary has a hashtag; we use #deptofnyvfwaux or #deptofny or #deptofnyaux. If you type that into a social media platform like Facebook or Instagram, the result is the same - you will be taken to whatever the Department has posted of photos, flyers, and other information on that platform. Many Auxiliaries share a Facebook page with their Posts – creating a hashtag that puts your Post/Auxiliary number after the prefix #vfw (for example, #vfw123456) will help your members, and the community, find your material. It is smart to create a hashtag that you will use repeatedly - such as #vfwaux123456, because if you broadcast that information to your members, it will help them locate your postings right away. You can make up and use multiple hashtags on the same post. This allows you to use several different key words or phrases – casting a wider 'net' to pull in the viewing public to see your posts. Treat them like a trail of markers to lead the readers to learn more about your Auxiliary's activities, events, and programs. Be sure to put in a "Historian & Media Relations" report if you create and use a new hashtag on a social media site. Therefore, here is to working smarter – not harder – to highlight our Auxiliaries and activities and our support to our cause. As always, please do not hesitate to call or drop me a line if you have any questions or comments.

It is an honor to serve as Department Historian /Media Relations Chairman this year and will do so with much excitement! "Lighting the Flame of Hope for Our Veterans" will provide us with wonderful memories while "Banding Together for Our Veterans."

#### Dear Members,

As we move into Fall, there are some things to remember - Please understand that the integrity of our organization depends on your thorough and honest inspection of the eligibility qualifications listed on these new member applications.

It is the responsibility of each investigation committee to know who is eligible for membership and who is not. Review the information provided in your podium edition for these qualifications. If you need help, please let me know. Make sure that all applications submitted are accurate, complete, and legible. This will avoid errors that need to be corrected later. Also, you need to send payment of the per capita of \$12.00 per member with each application. I do not have access to deduct payments for anything from your bank account. All checks should be made payable to VFW Auxiliary Department of New York.

Donation Report Forms are due September 30th, so please get them in ASAP so we can proceed to dues notices. The first dues notice will be mailed the beginning of October. Department is continuing to mail them only for Auxiliaries that contributed to the dues mailing fund on the donation report form. We are assuming that if your Auxiliary did not contribute, you have mailed your own notices.

Remember that your 990 is due by November 15th. It is required of **ALL** Auxiliaries. Our National Organization has two very good instructional videos on their website. Please go to vfwauxiliary.org, login with your username, choose Online Auxiliary Academy. The 2 videos are: 990N ePostcard Instructions and IRS Form 990N ePostcard Guide.

- ► Volunteer at a Food Bank.
- ▶ One Auxiliary assisted the Elks Club with a Mother's Day breakfast.

Mentoring for Leadership is sharing knowledge and experiences about our organization, to educate, train and encourage members to grow, advance and lead our Auxiliaries into the future.

#### Designing your Auxiliary Mentoring for Leadership Program

- 1. No two (2) Auxiliaries are the same . Your members' knowledge and experiences are NOT the same as any other Auxiliary. Your Auxiliary is unique. So your Mentoring for Leadership Program should be designed for your Auxiliary. Make it your own.
- 2. The Program is the plan for your Auxiliary. Since plans change, that means that your Mentoring Program can change. Your plan will have both types of Mentoring for Leadership types.
  - A. One-on-One mentoring, for example:
    - a. Long-time members sitting with new members to example and answer questions about meeting rituals and procedures.
    - b. Kitchen or bar manager demonstrating opening and closing procedures.
  - B. One-to-Group mentoring, for example:
    - a. Patriotic Instructor demonstrating "parade rest" and/or "heart salute".
    - b. Members explaining the new by-law changes and other procedures during the "Good of the Order". Note: The President should always have the latest Podium edition.
    - c. Auxiliary Program Chairmen outlining this year's programs.
    - d. Event Chairman explaining the details and procedures to make the events successful.
- 3. Any member (new or long-time) can be a Mentor; not only officers and chairmen. Everyone can be a Mentee and learn new procedures and skills. New members bring new ideas/knowledge.

Remember that as we Mentor members and others about our programs, we "Light the Flame of Hope for Our Veterans" while "Banding Together for Our Veterans.

The same "Change Form" is used when reporting a death in your Auxiliary. In this case, again, you can enter that yourself directly in MALTA. Just mark the form that it is already done. I will use the MALTA report when I create the Memorial book for Convention.

The youth activities program is a wonderful way to interact with and get youth involved in all of our Auxiliary programs. When I am thinking about ways to get our youth involved in activities, I first like to consider the cost involved to the teachers, leaders, family, and community members. Not only are we instilling good values and morals in our youth by giving them an opportunity to be involved but we are also teaching them the importance of recycling. Start by recycling all of those holiday cards. Cut out all of the useable wording and images. You can use as much or as little of the cards as you would like. Fold your cardstock in half and start gluing. I prefer to use mounting squares to avoid the rippling that will occur if you use too much glue. Write a simple message on the inside of the card, or leave it blank so the sender can add his or her own message if you are sending them overseas for our servicemen and women to send home to their loved ones. When the cards are completely dry slide them into envelopes. If you are not sending them overseas, finish them as you would like and they can be sent to a hospitalized Veteran. There are many lessons to be learned when we engage our youth and they will be proud of their accomplishments! Be sure to use the R.A.P. cards to recognize them for a job well done.

\$100 Drawing for all Auxiliaries that attain 85% in membership by Oct 15, 2023.



You can also write more on a sheet of paper and attach it with your report.

Be sure all forms are signed, the date of the last inspection is put up in the right-hand corner of the first page, and seals are put on the last page. All forms not completed will be returned to the District President for completion. Return all copies to the District President within a few days of your visit.

*District Presidents:* Do not hold inspections until you have several. Mail all copes to me within 5 days of receipt. I will send your copy back to you and the auxiliaries copy to them.
