NATIONAL SPECIAL ORDER # 328 ~ JUNE 29, 2023

Suspension VFW Auxiliary No. 348 ~ New York

Upon recommendation of the Department President and by order of the National President and in accordance with the National Bylaws, Article II, Sec 209, the Charter of VFW Auxiliary to Salt City Post No. 348, Syracuse, New York is hereby suspended for the period not to exceed ninety (90) days-from June 29, 2023 to September 27, 2023 (3 meetings) - for:

1. Failure to elect and install Officers for 2023-2024.

The following procedures are to be followed:

- 1. While under suspension, the business and affairs of the VFW Aux may be carried on in a sphere limited to current activities (paying financial agreements already incurred and reinstatement from suspension under a Department Committee. The Auxiliary may hold meetings but is **not** to make and pass motions to expend money until the suspension is lifted unless the Committee approves. If motions to expend money were passed **prior** to the suspension, then those motions should be honored, and the expenses incurred paid.
- 2. Membership dues should be continuously transmitted.
- 3. The Department President shall establish this Committee and she shall grant it written powers and limitations.
- 4. The Committee shall consist of three (3) members- Darlene Baker, Linda Flanagan, and Agnes Stampp-but does not include the Department President nor the current District President. The Committee is to attend the monthly business meetings as well as other meetings deemed necessary.
- 5. The Committee members may use the "Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit" and other mentoring tools available in Auxiliary Resources such as <u>Building on the Auxiliary Foundation</u> and the Booklet of Instructions and Treasurer's Guide to assist the Auxiliary Officers and members in understanding their duties and roles in the VFW Auxiliary.
- 6. All acts and actions of the committee shall be subject to the approval or disapproval of the Department President, who, in addition to each Committee member, shall submit to the National President through the National Secretary-Treasurer—shall forward her/his written report for each meeting attended regarding the situation and resolution of the suspension.

The Department President will see that this order is executed immediately.

NATIONAL SPECIAL ORDER # 33 ~ AUGUST 31, 2023

Cancellation VFW Auxiliary No. 6105 ~ New York

Upon recommendation of the Department President and by order of the National President, the Charter of Hilton-Parma Memorial Auxiliary to VFW Post No. 6105, Hilton, New York, is cancelled and declared defunct due to:

- 1. Failure of the Auxiliary to elect and install officers for 2023-2024 term, 2023-2024 bond was not paid, and audits weren't conducted and presented at regular meetings before forwarding to Department Treasurer.
- 2. The Auxiliary did not hold meetings during the 2022-2023 term.
- A letter was written to the members and a majority responded that they favored disbanding Auxiliary.

The following procedures are to be followed:

- 1. All business transactions shall cease immediately and no business may be transacted in the name of the Auxiliary upon receipt of this Special Order.
- 2. No money shall be spent, nor debt(s) incurred upon receipt of this Special Order.
- 3. As soon as possible, and not to exceed thirty (30) days, the property of the Auxiliary including books of record, original application cards, papers and all money belonging to the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Department President or his/her Representative for disposition as directed by the Department Council of Administration. All accounts in any financial institutions shall be closed and a cashier's check(s) for the balance in said account(s) made payable to the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York for disposition by the Department Council of Administration.
- 4. The Department President shall forward the new VFW Auxiliary Charter to National Headquarters.
- 5. If the Auxiliary is Incorporated, a dissolution of the corporation must be filed by the Auxiliary with the appropriate state office.

The Department President will see that this order is executed immediately.

NATIONAL SPECIAL ORDER # 46 ~ SEPTEMBER 20, 2023

Cancellation VFW Auxiliary No. 153 ~ New York

The Charter of Albert Glen Richardson VFW Post No. 153, Baldwinsville, New York was cancelled by direct order of the Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States on August 21, 2023, and received by the National VFW Auxiliary Headquarters on August 23, 2023, in accordance with letter from the Commander-in-Chief, therefore:

1. Albert Glen Richardson Auxiliary to VFW Post No. 153, Baldwinsville, New York, is hereby cancelled and dropped from the rolls of the National Organization due to the Commander-in-Chief's order and since the Auxiliary has failed to pay its bond, the Dept President concurs that the Aux should be cancelled at this time rather than being suspended. The Aux did receive notice that it would be cancelled due to the cancellation of the VFW Post.

The following procedures are to be followed:

- 1. All business transactions shall cease immediately and no business may be transacted in the name of the Auxiliary upon receipt of this Special Order.
- 2. No money shall be spent, nor debt(s) incurred upon receipt of this Special Order.
- 3. As soon as possible, and not to exceed thirty (30) days, the property of the Auxiliary including books of record, original application cards, papers and all money belonging to the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Department President or his/her Representative for disposition as directed by the Department Council of Administration. All accounts in any financial institutions shall be closed and a cashier's check(s) for the balance in said account(s) made payable to the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York for disposition by the Department Council of Administration.
- $4. \ \ The \ Department \ President \ shall \ forward \ the \ new \ VFW \ Auxiliary \ Charter \ to \ National \ Headquarters.$
- 5. If the Auxiliary is Incorporated, a dissolution of the corporation must be filed by the Auxiliary with the appropriate state office.

The Department President will see that this order is executed immediately.

Cancellation VFW Auxiliary No. 1314 ~ New York

Upon recommendation of the Department President and by order of the National President and in accordance with the National Bylaws, Article II, Section 209, the Charter of VFW Auxiliary to Columbia County Post No. 1314 Hudson, New York, is hereby cancelled and declared defunct due to:

2. In accordance with Section 207 of the National Bylaws, Auxiliary No. 1314 did not follow the procedure as outlined to surrender its charter by notifying members and other District and Department Officers of the failure to elect and install officers for 2023-2024, so at a meeting held on May 31, 2023, there were only the President, Sr. Vice President and Treasurer present, the Auxiliary will be closed due to no quorum to support the direction of the Auxiliary and the Department President was notified of the need to cancel Auxiliary 1314.

The following procedures are to be followed:

- 1. All business transactions shall cease immediately, and no business may be transacted in the name of the Auxiliary upon receipt of this Special Order.
- 2. No money shall be spent, nor debt(s) incurred upon receipt of this Special Order.
- 3. As soon as possible, and not to exceed thirty (30) days, the property of the Auxiliary including books of record, original application cards, papers and all money belonging to the Auxiliary shall be turned over to the Department President or his/her Representative for disposition as directed by the Department Council of Administration. All accounts in any financial institutions shall be closed and a cashier's check(s) for the balance in said account(s) made payable to the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York for disposition by the Department Council of Administration.
- 4. The Department President shall forward the new VFW Auxiliary Charter to National Headquarters.
- 5. If the Auxiliary is Incorporated, a dissolution of the corporation must be filed by the Auxiliary with the appropriate state office.

The Department President will see that this order is executed immediately.

If it Flies it spies Legacy Member Edition!

National Historian Diana Morris has a new project for Auxiliary Historians - to complete a 3–5-minute video interview with a legacy member—someone who has been around for a long time and has served in multiple capacities. The details are outlined on the entry form, which can be found on MALTA, or the Department website under the Historian Program.

Here are some sample questions: Ask why they joined. Ask about their favorite memorable moments. Place emphasis on bringing the past to life. We would like you to ask them what they like about the organization. What have they seen change. What they would like to have come back, that might not happen anymore. Remember you only have 3-5 minutes so make them count. Note: If your Auxiliary has no legacy members, you can also interview a District or Department member. You might also want to ask them how being a volunteer has affected their lives. All interviews should be sent to me.

Since the interview is a new concept, I have had lots of questions about it. I think it would be beneficial to all if I went over some of the guidelines for the video.

Why are our members being asked to make a video interview? Members of the VFW Auxiliary are made up of a diverse group that spans many generations. Whether you are a member of the Silent Generation (1928 - 1945) or the latest tech savvy Gen Alpha Generation (2013-to present), we all have something to contribute. Recording the interview helps us preserve our past and leaves a footprint for the future.

How Do I record and submit the video? There are multiple ways to send your videos to me. An easy way to do this is with your phone or iPad, because it can be easily shared by email. I encourage you to post these interviews on social media as well. You can also send them to me by using a thumb drive and mail them to me.

What do I need to include with the video when sending to the Dept. Historian? This is very important! I am asking every person who sends a recording to also send the National Historian Award #1 Form. This is necessary because at the end of the year, every Auxiliary will receive a National citation for carrying out this project. This gives me the opportunity to track who has sent reports for the numbers to National at the end of the year.

It is an honor to serve as Department Historian /Media Relations Chairman this year and will do so with much excitement! "Light the Flame of Hope for Our Veterans" will provide us with wonderful memories while "Banding Together for Our Veterans."

- 1. Presidents share copies of your monthly agenda with the Vice Presidents.
- 2. Show new members the different sections of the ritual and explain meeting procedures.
- 3. Appoint newer members to fill in for absent officers.
- 4. Review current year National and Department Auxiliary program goals.
- 5. Review Auxiliary Standing Motions and meeting procedures annually.
- 6. Review officers' duties during "Suggestions for the Good of the Order" monthly meetings. Reviews should be completed before the April elections to ensure enlightened candidates.
- 7. Review District, Department and National meeting procedures with delegates prior to any Meeting, Conference or Convention. Pair 1st timers with experienced delegates.

Membership Drives, Family Fun Festivals and Fund-Raising Events:

- 1. Appoint Chair (Co-Chairs) and ask for "helpers" to serve on the committee.
- 2. Stress experience not required but "many hands make light work."
- 3. Share when, where and how events were organized in the past.
- 4. Offer tactful suggestions instead of negative comments.
- 5. Encourage other members to:

"Light the Flame of Hope for Our Veterans" while "Banding Together for Our Veterans."

Memoriable mentors lead by example as they welcome members with their <u>smile</u>, <u>share</u> their knowledge and experiences; <u>show</u> resources, such as: the by-laws, the ritual, and the sections of the "Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation; <u>support</u> their members while they learn and advance.
