GENERAL ORDERS # 1 ~ AUGUST 2024 – (Must be read at the FIRST meeting following receipt before being filed.)

- 1. Having been duly elected by acclamation and installed as Department President at the 99th annual convention held June 7-9, 2024 at the Marriott Hotel in Albany, NY, and working in accordance with the Bylaws and Ritual of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Auxiliary, I, Darlene Baker, hereby assume command of the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York. All previous having appointments are declared null and void and the new officers and chairmen assignments are now in effect.
- 2. Official communications intended for the Department President shall be addressed to: Darlene Baker at:
 - 42 Willard Drive, Bernhards Bay, NY 13028
- 3. Requests for rulings shall come through the VFW Auxiliary Secretary, by order of the VFW Auxiliary President, and shall bear the VFW Auxiliary seal. All requests must be in writing and addressed to the Department President who shall forward the request for a ruling to the National President.
- 4. The official headquarters for the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York is hereby declared to be located at:

1799 Fred Road, Schenectady, NY 12303

All mail intended for the Department Secretary should be addressed to: Christine Leavor, 2027 Cemetery Hill Rd., Franklinville, NY 14737.

5. Checks intended for the Department of New York VFW Auxiliary shall be payable to "VFW Auxiliary Department of New York (VFW Aux DNY)" earmarked for the fund intended. Checks for Department business should be mailed to:

Department Treasurer, Kim White 1799 Fred Road Schenectady, NY 12303

Checks for specific projects or fundraisers should be mailed to the Program Chairman unless otherwise specified.

- 6. The VFW Auxiliary President shall countersign all checks drawn by the Treasurer. VFW Auxiliaries may not possess ATM (Automatic Teller Machine) cards, and/or debit or credit cards. The disbursement of money shall be upon motion made and passed at a meeting with the exception of the transmittal of membership dues, which does not require a motion. Refer to Sec. 801A- Auxiliary President of the current Bylaws.
- 7. VFW Auxiliaries are reminded to donate to the Cancer Grant Fund based on Auxiliary membership quota as of June 30, 3024 and are asked for donations to be made through MALTA by the Auxiliary Treasurer.
- 8. VFW Auxiliaries are encouraged to donate a minimum of \$0.10 (10 cents) per member for the VFW National Home for Children "Health and Happiness" based on the June 30, 2024 membership quota. Treasurers may process this donation directly through MALTA or mail a check made payable to "VFW Auxiliary" earmarked Health & Happiness" directly to: VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters, 406 West 34th St., 10th Floor, Kansas City, MO 64111.

- 9. Inspectors are required to attend a School of Instruction held in their respective District. Official visits (on all levels) are to be completed by January 15, 2025.
- 10. It shall be the duty of the Trustees to ensure that the offices of the VFW Auxiliary President and Treasurer are bonded with an indemnity company authorized by the National Headquarters or the Department as surety in a sum at least double the amount of funds and value of property for which, so far as can be anticipated, the VFW Auxiliary President and Treasurer may be accountable. Refer to Sec. 814-Trustees, Duties of (All Levels) of the current Bylaws.
- 11. The President shall hold the original bond for both the President and Treasurer. A copy of the President and Treasurer bonds shall be incorporated into the Minutes book.
- 12. Per VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters: There is no minimum age requirement for the bond to cover an officer. If a loss occurs, the bonding company may legally pursue indemnity against the person regardless of age. Therefore, any member in good standing is eligible to hold the office of President or Treasurer.
- 13. Presidents on all levels shall, within thirty (30) calendar days of assuming office, submit to the Commander of the corresponding VFW unit a financial report and membership count of their Auxiliary. Refer to Sec. 810- President, Duties of (All Levels) of the current Bylaws.
- 14. Auxiliary Treasurers shall, upon the death of an Auxiliary member, immediately enter the name and date of death in MALTA or send the information to the Department Secretary.
- 15. It shall be the duty of the Auxiliary Trustees to properly audit the books and records of the Treasurer and Secretary no later than thirty (30) days following the expiration of each quarterly period. Refer to Sec. 814-Trustees, Duties (All Levels) of the current Bylaws. Quarterly Audit report forms must be received by the Department Treasurer no later than sixty (60) days following the end of each quarter as follows: August 31st (April 1-Jun 30); November 30th (July 1- Sept. 30); February 28th (Oct 1- Dec. 31); May 31st (Jan. 1- Mar. 31, 2025). The quarterly Audit report form should be submitted to the Department Treasurer, Kim White, by USPS mail or scanned and emailed only. The Audit report form may not be sent via text message.
- 16. Auxiliaries should submit the 2024-2025 Donation Report Form by September 30, 2024 to the Department Treasurer.
- 17. All Department correspondence to the Auxiliaries is to be sent to the Auxiliary President. The Auxiliary President is an elected officer and is responsible for seeing that the correspondence is properly complied with. He/She has the authority to act on the correspondence if it is something that must be taken care of before her/his next Auxiliary meeting.

Click on Advocacy and select Legislative Priorities. You can also visit vfwauxny.org, click on Legislative and go to 2024 Priority Goals. These goals will keep us informed of the key issues the VFW will be advocating on our Veterans' behalf: Budget, Education, Employment and Transition Assistance, Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs, Health Care, Military Quality of Life and National Security, Foreign Affairs and POW/MIA.

Sign up for the FREE "VFW Action Corps Weekly." This is a weekly email newsletter that will keep you informed about Legislation that is being introduced and/or passed. Links are provided for us to *participate* by taking action in contacting our local senators and representatives.

We have a call to action at this time. We are asking our Congressional Representative to Pass H.R. 8371, the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, and send this VFW supported BILL to the Senate.

Welcome, Auxiliary Family, to a new year of service!

Department President Baker has been installed and her Officers and Chairmen have already been working hard. Please be sure to read the General Orders #1 and President's Message from the Auxiliary News at your meeting. The Auxiliary News is an OFFICIAL COMMUNICATION and meant to be shared at your meetings under official communications, especially the President's letter and any special or general orders. In addition, communications from Department Chairmen and officers are official communications. Sometimes my messages are sent to the Auxiliaries by way of the District President and/or the District Secretary. That does not make them any less OFFICIAL. Sometimes a President does not have an email address on the election form, and then I send to the Secretary or Treasurer. And sometimes I send messages to all three to be sure at least one will receive it and take it to a meeting.

Communication is very important. I wish I had a nickel for every Auxiliary that told me they did not know about dues increasing - it was sent as a memo from National, and from me to every Auxiliary to prepare and consider adjusting dues before July 1st. Your Auxiliary Treasurer is now the only one who can change your dues if you are not charging at least \$20. If you do not change them, starting July 1, \$20 will be deducted every time you transmit an annual member's dues. If you are not charging at least \$20, your Auxiliary will be paying the difference. If you need help, I can walk you through it. My contact information is on page 2 of the Guidebook.

I mailed Guidebooks and Chairmen's promotional materials to ALL Auxiliary Presidents who did not pick them up at the Convention. Some were picked up by the District President and if you have not received them you need to ask the District President. Some of the material is time sensitive.

To prepare for your official visits, be sure to have your bond, your ACCEPTED 990E Postcard, and your last four (4) audits ready for inspection.

As you receive this, you are hopefully making your preparations to head to Binghamton for OTI. Remember, despite its name, it is NOT just for Officers. It is for MEMBERS - new and "less new" - to learn about the organization, changes in bylaws, and hopefully to encourage them to take a step up the leadership ladder.

Lastly, some of your Auxiliaries are already changing officers. Please remember, to always notify the Department Secretary when your Auxiliary has any officer change, and keep MALTA updated with name changes, addresses, phone numbers, email changes and deceased members. Have a great year

Why? Auxiliary visibility improves our image and could increase membership. Area communities have been helping veterans and their families for years – now is the TIME to "pay it back."

How to get credit? Report to the Department Auxiliary Outreach Chairman, by email or USPS, the Auxiliary approved and recorded motions for the TIME members volunteered to make their partners events/missions successful while wearing Auxiliary attire or items that make you easily recognizable as: "VFW Auxiliary."

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- 2023-2024 motions became invalid April 1, 2024. New motions are required for 2024-2025.
- Auxiliary Outreach is for donated **TIME** only. Projects/events must be organized/controlled by groups to benefit or improve the community, its residents, animals, and/or environment.
- Auxiliary fund-raising events, raffles, etc. for non-profit organizations ARE NOT Outreach.
- Monetary donations and/or purchased items, such as: clothing, toys, etc. ARE NOT Outreach.
- Auxiliary members volunteering **TIME** must be easily recognizable as VFW Auxiliary members.
- Auxiliary members, who are Board members of approved partners, CANNOT report their hours.
- Events may be held at the Post Home but must be organized/managed by the non-profit partner.
- Projects that are reportable to other VFW and/or Auxiliary Programs Chairmen CANNOT be reported as Outreach; for example: Americanism, Hospital, Veterans Family Support or Youth.

Fall Conference: All Auxiliaries who <u>report</u> approved 2024-2025 motions, partners, attire worn, and TIME with partners by Sep 30, 2024, will be entered into a \$25 drawing. Reports accepted via email or USPS.

Dear Auxiliary Members,

Welcome to the 2024-2025 program year as we are "Soaring Into the Next Century of Service with Our Veterans and Their Families." At the beginning of each new program year, there are commonly asked questions by Auxiliary Officers and members. Below are questions and answers to help kick off a successful 2024-2025.

- 1. I am a newly elected or re-elected Auxiliary President. What do I need to provide to my Post Commander?

 Ans. Refer to Bylaws Sec. 810—President Duties of The President, within 30 days after induction into office, shall submit to the Commander the last quarterly audit and membership status report. (You may provide a copy of the most current Audit and notate the total number of Auxiliary members.)
- 2. How should I prepare for my first meeting?
 - **Ans**. a. Begin by reviewing the 2024-2025 Program Guidebook that was included in your President's packet. Highlight due dates and requests for each program. Provide Auxiliary Chairmen with a copy of their program. Additional Program books may be purchased for \$7 each. Contact the Dept. Secretary.
 - b. Prepare a written agenda prior to your meeting. Ensure that you have the most current edition of the Podium Book, along with a gavel, your agenda, and copy of *Auxiliary News* for each of your meetings.
- 3. When is the April June Audit due?
 - **Ans**. Refer to Bylaws Sec. 814—Trustees, Duties of The *trustees* should complete the April 1 to June 30, 2024, audit prior to July 31, 2024. The audit should then be voted on at the August meeting. The Senior Trustee should send the report to our Department Treasurer, Kim White. The audit may be USPS mailed, scanned or emailed. **Do not text** the audit. Quarterly Audit form can be found on pg 52 in the 24-25 Program Guidebook.
- 4. Program Reporting How and when do I send a report?
 - **Ans.** The Department Program Report form can be found on the back page of the 2024-2025 Program Guidebook. The program report form can be documented and emailed, scanned or USPS mailed to the Department Chairman after each project/event is completed. If you cannot make a copy of the program report, Department Chairman will accept reports using email, post cards, and other paper reports. Ensure that your **Auxiliary** and **District Number** are identified on your report.

<u>Zoom Training Sessions</u>- Communication and training are important to achieve success. The Department Chief of Staff / Mentoring Chairman will host monthly "**Zoom Training Sessions**". All members are encouraged to attend. Each month, beginning in September, a different VFW Auxiliary topic will be featured. The Zoom will last approximately 30 minutes. Time will be allotted for questions and answers. After each Zoom Training Session, the information will be posted on the Department website: vfwauxny.org \rightarrow Resources \rightarrow Zoom Trainings.

I look forward to working with all members of the VFW Auxiliary Department of New York team. Feel free to contact me either through email or telephone if you have any questions.

Share Auxiliary News and Events with Local Media

As Auxiliary members, we are interested in what our Auxiliaries do and who we help. However, members often wonder if their Auxiliary's events and/or programs are interesting to those outside the organization. Before you reach out to local media, ask yourself these four questions:

- 1. Is it timely?
- 3. Is it new or unique?

2. Is it local?

4. Would it interest you if you weren't a member?

If you answered yes to at least two of the above questions, contact your local media with Auxiliary news! Not sure how to contact them or what to include? Visit the Program & Publicity Resources page on the National website and review the following documents under the Historian/Media Relations section:

- <u>How to Share Your Local Auxiliary Story Ideas and Events with Local Media</u>: Provides information about: What is and is not newsworthy, how to get your event covered, who to contact, how far in advance to make contact and press release tips.
- <u>VFW Auxiliary Publicity Guide</u>: Includes the following samples: fact sheet, news release, radio and television public service announcements (PSAs), and media interview questions and answers.

When sending story ideas, be sure to include the National fact sheet, photos of the event and/or program, and who to contact if they have questions. Do not forget to thank the media when they cover your Auxiliary's event and/or program. A thank you note, certificate of recognition for local media, or other acknowledgement of appreciation is a nice (and often unexpected) gesture. You can invite the media to a Department awards ceremony, or even ask if you can go to their workplace to do a special presentation. That would certainly be a surprise for the person who did the reporting!

If your story doesn't get covered by your local media – but especially if it does get covered! – share the information with your District and Department. Most Departments have a newsletter, e-newsletter and/or Facebook page, all of which are great ways to communicate the wonderful ways Auxiliaries participate in our Programs and how members help veterans and their families.

It is an honor to serve as Department Historian /Media Relations Chairman this year and will do so with much excitement! "Soaring Into the Next Century of Service with Our Veterans and Their Families" will provide us with wonderful memories "From Our Roots to Our Branches Extending Service to Our Veterans."

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced that more than 53,000 women Veterans enrolled in VA health care between May 2023 and May 2024, marking a 20% increase over the previous year and the largest enrollment year for women Veterans on record.

Health care enrollment of women Veterans increased across all 50 states. Women Veterans are currently VA's fastest growing patient population. Expanding access to benefits and services for women Veterans is a key priority for VA.

In 1948, women were granted a formal place in our country's military. Today, the more than 2 million women Veterans living in the U.S. make up our fastest growing Veteran population," said **VA Deputy Secretary Tanya Bradsher**. "It's important to all of us here at VA that every woman Veteran knows she belongs at VA."

"It's our goal for every woman Veteran to receive all the benefits she has earned, and that includes world-class health care," said **VA Under Secretary for Health Shereef Elnahal, M.D.** "We want women Veterans to know that VA has invested in more services for women Veterans than ever before. VA can now offer women the best and most accessible options for all their care needs, and we want them to apply for the health care they deserve today."

Today, there is a women's health program led by a Women Veterans Program Manager at every VA health care system across the nation. Additional specialized women's health staff include: Women's Health Medical Directors, Women's Health Primary Care Providers, Women's Health Patient Aligned Care Teams, Maternity Care Coordinators, Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening Coordinators, and Women's Mental Health Champions. Women's health teams are also supported by LGBTQ+ Veteran Care Coordinators, Intimate Partner Violence Coordinators, and Military Sexual Trauma Coordinators

VA is also delivering disability compensation benefits to an all-time number of women Veterans. More than 89% of women Veterans who have applied have received disability benefits from VA for at least one condition, on average receiving \$27,109 in earned disability compensation benefits per year.

VA's dedicated <u>Women Veterans Call Center</u> is here to support woman Veterans in navigating all the services they may need, including health care and benefits.
