Harassment and discrimination include any verbal, non-verbal, or physical conduct that is sufficiently severe or pervasive to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment, or that otherwise interferes with another's ability to participate in VFW Auxiliary activities. All members are expected to conduct themselves with dignity, respect, professionalism, and common courtesy always.

Hello, my Auxiliary Family! This year, Department President Justine and her officers have committed to working closely, like a family. Let's start thinking of our Auxiliary Brothers and Sisters in the same way. We call them Brothers and Sisters – family.

Let's reach out (again if necessary) to those members who have not yet paid their dues. We should be asking them "why." There might be some who don't want to be part of the family anymore, but if my sibling told me they didn't want to be related to me anymore, I'd want to know why.

We cannot retain our Auxiliary family if we don't meet their needs. Maybe they think we spend too much time in a meeting- an agenda can speed up meetings. Maybe they don't think we do enough for our veterans- ask them to plan or help plan a project for your Auxiliary.

Sadly, maybe the Auxiliary dues are financially impossible right now. No member is going to say, "I can't afford \$25 right now" but if you reach out you might hear "I got laid off at my job last month" or "I had back surgery and haven't been able to work." THAT, my Brothers and Sisters is an acceptable use of your Relief Fund. Offer help.

Remember, while recruiting new members can help us grow and find potential for future leadership, retaining the ones we have shows we value those members. We care about them.

I close with a reminder that members do NOT have until June 30 to pay their dues. Dues are due by December 31st. Their annual card says 2025, not 2026 until they pay their dues. They cannot attend meetings, receive a cancer grant, hold an office, or enjoy any other benefits as Auxiliary members because they are not members in good standing. The June 30th date is just a grace period to reinstate their continuous status and not have to start over.

It was great seeing everyone at the Fall Conference. I want to thank all the Auxiliaries and members who have sent in reports already this year. Keep up the great work and I look forward to reading all your reports – keep the reporting coming! And Congratulations to District 8 for attaining 100% in reporting.

With the Holiday Season approaching, we can support our Veterans with gratitude at our holiday parties and in our holiday cards. Some suggestions are:

- a. Post a sign stating "Join the VFW Action Corps Weekly QR code" someplace in the Post where members and guests will see it and are able to scan it.
- b. Slip one of the business cards with the QR code on it into your holiday cards with a little note stating "help support our Veterans."
- c. Have a Youth Group help with the holiday cards and educate them on the VFW Action Corps Weekly.

Remember if you are not into the QR codes, you can always make phone calls and send letters to your local government officials. It doesn't matter how we make contact, we just need to make contact. Most importantly, we need to be informed in order to participate and keep everyone educated.

The Legislative National Ambassador has sent out some statistics regarding the usage of the Action Corps Weekly. The State of New York has 13,197 subscribers; sadly we have 109 members participating, which is .82 %. This means there are 13,088 members who are not taking action just in NY. We need to do better! Nationwide, we are 1.4 million members strong; our organization's membership makes an impact lawmakers cannot ignore.

I have emailed the Legislative Priorities and all the Legislative Program QR codes to the District Presidents. I hope you find information helpful when promoting the program and Thank you for sharing all the information. Also, keep an eye out for the VFW Action Alerts. We need to keep our voices heard for our Veterans.

- X Did you know that many cancers can be caused by a hereditary mutation? Genetic testing can detect inherited mutations that may increase your cancer risk! The test itself is easier than giving blood and the results can help relieve anxiety of the fear of unknown or provide information you can use to decrease your cancer risk, allowing you the ability to provide information to your blood relatives that can impact their health and to your health care provider that can be used to help catch cancer early. *Having a cancer-related mutation does not mean you WILL get cancer. It indicates you're at an increased risk. Genetic counselors can help you navigate the process of deciding if a genetic test is right for you and help you understand any positive mutation discovery.
