NATIONAL OFFICIAL RULING ~ Costs Incurred by Disciplinary Actions ~ NOVEMBER 5, 2025

At the 2025 VFW Auxiliary National Convention in Columbus, Ohio, the **VFW Auxiliary National Bylaw, Article XI, Sec. 1101 – Discipline of Members** was amended to add item D. and it passed. To resolve any confusion concerning this addition, I have made this official ruling on the interpretation of this Bylaw.

As stated in **Sec. 1101. D., All costs incurred by Disciplinary Action will be paid by the initiating entity (Auxiliary, Department, or National).**

Therefore, be it known that:

- The intent of “all costs” means all reasonable costs that may be incurred by the Disciplinary Action Hearing Panel.
- The composition of the Disciplinary Action Hearing Panel, as stated in the new Guide to Disciplinary Action, page 23, are the Disciplinary Action Hearing Panel President and the Hearing Panel Members.
- The Disciplinary Action Hearing Panel does not include the Prosecutor, the Recording Officer, the Accused and the Defense Counsel, nor the Witnesses (whether for the Prosecution or the Defense).

NATIONAL SPECIAL ORDER #142 ~ NOVEMBER 17, 2025

Cancellation of VFW Auxiliary No. 1417 ~ New York

Upon recommendation of the Department President and by order of the National President, the Charter of Auxiliary to Morris Memorial VFW Post No. 1417, Morris, New York, is cancelled and declared defunct due to:

1. Failure to elect and install Officers for 2025-2026.
2. Failure to purchase a bond.
3. Failure to complete and submit an audit.

Notice of the cancellation of the Charter was provided to the Auxiliary and VFW thirty days prior to this Special Order. The Department President will see that this order is executed immediately.

Greetings Auxiliary Brothers and Sisters! Can you believe we are now past the half-way mark in our membership year? Tonight, as I write this the Department is over 92% paid membership. I appreciate everything you have done up to this point, but now I have to ask you to do more.

The December 31st goal was to cross the George Washington Bridge with 100% paid membership and 90% of your annual members retained. I am writing this before that, so I'm not sure yet if your Auxiliary has met its goal.

The drawing for the Mario Cuomo Memorial Bridge Crossing (85% paid membership and an extra \$50 if 75% of your annual members were retained) by October 31st was held at my Auxiliary meeting on December 15th. Official Visit Reports & PIP

Official visit reports are coming in very slowly. We are way behind where we should be. The sooner we make those Official Visits the sooner we can recognize excellent Auxiliaries and/or get Auxiliaries the help they need. There is always room for improvement. District Presidents if you know of an Auxiliary that could use a Performance Improvement Plan (PIP) contact me.

Here are some suggestions of what could be included in your “plan”:

1. Establish a recruitment plan – it’s important to replace members. Strive for “**current**” membership totals rather than “paid.”
2. Ensure that your Trustees are performing proper audits-Treasurer should NOT be doing them.
3. Appoint chairmen for all of the programs? Appoint and encourage new chairmen but make sure you assign a former chairmen to mentor them. Reporting is necessary to maintain non-profit status.
4. Keeping in contact with your members is very important in maintaining a healthy Auxiliary.
5. Use an agenda so your meetings will run smoothly. Traditional, contemporary and round table are all acceptable meeting formats.



I encourage each Auxiliary to consider adopting some of these suggestions.

Let's consider some SWATTs: Sharing Wonderful Auxiliary Tips & Tricks ...

- ❖ Have your members participated in activities since April 1, 2025, that are appropriate for a VFW Auxiliary program, but you haven't yet reported to the Department program chairman?
- ❖ Ask your members – at a meeting, via email or individually – what they have been doing this year. You may learn that they have been busy with activities that can be reported.

Specifically for the Auxiliary Outreach program ...

- ❖ Local organizations your members already belong to or volunteer with may be opportunities for additional members to participate. (Make your motion or standing rule to include any members, rather than only one or two certain members.)
- ❖ Proactively ask suitable (non-political, non-religious, non-veteran) local organizations about their needs and volunteer opportunities.
- ❖ When your mail includes fund-raisers from national organizations, consider whether they have local chapters or events. And whether there are similar local organizations.

To stand out from other auxiliaries, when you send a program report ...

- ❖ Include photos or newspaper articles.
- ❖ Provide a full description of the activity or event.
- ❖ Let us know how the members or the community were affected by your involvement.

Happy New Year Fellow Auxiliary Members!

I hope everyone had a wonderful Holiday season! Previously I reported that NY had 13197 Action Corps Weekly subscribers. That has now increased by 500 for a total of 13697 subscribers. Congratulations! But, we still have a huge problem!!! Only 205 people took action on recent bills; 58 people took action on HR 1815 and 147 people took action on the NDAA. We need to do better New York!! The action alerts come right to your email, and you just fill in your information and click send. It's that easy. You will receive a confirmation email from the legislators, which you can then forward to me. Include your Auxiliary and District number and I will give your Auxiliary credit. I would love to receive 13697 emails!! There are 2 calls to action at this time.

1. HR 4837 Written Informed Consent Act, which would require clear, written information before the VA prescribes certain psychiatric medications.

2. HR 2623 Innovative Therapies Centers of Excellence Act of 2025, which would create five VA centers to expand access to cutting-edge PTSD treatments.

Veterans deserve transparency, safety and real choices – NOT a maze of prescriptions and side effects. You can take action today on these bills and help boost people taking action by doing the following:

1. Post Action Alerts on your Social Media today.
2. Share the Action Alert Link via social media or email.
3. Print and post flyers at your VFW Post, Community Boards, Bowling Alleys, Libraries, etc.
4. Write up a letter, then print it or email the letter to your members to sign and mail to their legislators.

(Remember to add the hashtags #auxiliarylegislative, #honorthethecontract when posting to your Social Media.)

HOT OFF THE PRESS: VFW Voice of Service—Stories in Action is now live, which will get Veterans stories to congress. Stories are what makes the lawmakers listen.
