IMPORTANT DATES

By the <u>1st day of the month</u> the auxiliary program chairmen need to submit their report to each of the Department Program Chairmen.

By the 7th day of the month the Department Chairmen need to submit their reports to me.

On the 10th day of the month the Program Coordinator's Report will be posted on the Department Website.

If your auxiliary donates on the Donation Report Form this will count as a donation, but you need to complete projects and report them to the Department Chairmen to qualify for awards.

THE MEANING OF THE D, P and H & H

The "**D**" is for donations to a program. The "**P**" is for participation in a program.

The **H & H** is for the VFW National Home Health and Happiness donations. You need to send a minimum donation of **\$0.10 per member** which is based on the **June 30, 2024,** auxiliary membership total. You may donate to this through MALTA or mail your checks to:

OFFICIAL VISIT FOR INSPECTIONS

"Soaring Into the Next Century of Service

With Our Veteran's and Their Families"

Official visits, for the purpose of inspecting an Auxiliary, are to help the Department recognize Auxiliaries who are struggling to remain a viable part of the Department and National Organization. Many Auxiliaries have been lost because it was not recognized early enough to give them the assistance and support they needed.

The District President appoints inspectors to assist him/her in getting the official visits (inspections) done in a timely manner. It is honorable for the District President to visit all the auxiliaries, but it is not necessary they do all the inspections themselves.

Rules for District Presidents regarding inspections:

- DO NOT try to do all the inspections yourself.
- DO NOT send the same inspector to an Auxiliary they inspected last year.
- SCHEDULE a School of Instruction for inspectors early in your auxiliary year (i.e., at an organizational meeting or your first District meeting in the Fall.
- REVIEW the inspection form for completeness before forwarding it to me. It will be returned to you to get the missing answers from the inspector or Auxiliary President.
- SEND completed form and copy of accepted 990N to me within seven (7) days.

Rules for Inspectors:

- CONTACT Auxiliary President to set date, time, and place for inspection and be prompt for the visit.
- SIX MONTHS must elapse between inspections.
- ATTEND meeting and COMPLETE the inspection form.
- VERIFY EIN (Employee Identification Number) and date 990N was completed and accepted.
- GET signatures of President, Secretary and Treasurer. Make sure the Treasurer's address is correct.
- BE HONEST in answering all questions and your assessment of the Auxiliary.
- FORWARD all copies of inspection, with copy of accepted 990N, to the District President within three (3) days.
- IF UNABLE to do the inspection, notify the District President and return all items to the District President so a new inspector can be appointed.

Inspection forms have been redesigned, but still will be used to recognize Auxiliaries who need assistance. Once received, I will review the form. The Auxiliary copy will be returned to the Auxiliary Treasurer (hence the need for a correct, complete address) and the District copy will be returned to the District President. A copy will be forwarded to the Department President for any Auxiliary that needs assistance.

It is Darlene's and my goal to have all inspections done by JANUARY 15, 2025. Before the Christmas Holiday would even be better.

4. Star Family Recognition

- **Gold Star-** is a banner displayed when a family member has made the ulOmate sacrifice while serving in the armed forces during war zone.
- Blue Star- is a banner displayed when a family member is actively serving in the armed forces.
- **Silver Star-** is a banner displayed when a family member has been wounded, contracted a serious illness or injury in a war zone.
- White Star- the White Star designation recognizes families who have lost a service member to suicide, whether they were military or first responders.

If you are unable to attend the conference, "Don't worry about it...I'll sign the card for you!" Forms will be included in the Presidents package, or you can email me for one.

<u>NATIONAL AWARDS for AUXILIARIES</u>: Citation and \$25 to one VFW Auxiliary in each of the 10 program divisions that hosts the most outstanding activity and/or event educating their community about lesser-known Patriotic Holidays.

DEPARTMENT AWARDS for AUXILIARIES: The Auxiliary that has the most outstanding Patriotism Program will receive a Citation and (\$20) for First Place; (\$15) for Second Place; and (\$10) for third Place in each membership group. Plus a Citation to each Auxiliary that Participate in the 2024-2025 Massing of the Colors at Department Convention.

Who? What? When? Where? Why? & How?

WHO should your Auxiliary members approach to establish partnerships?

- Non- profit, civic and other organizations that support residents, animals, and the environment can be approached in
 person, by letter or email to offer partnerships that will provide volunteers to help and assist in making their company
 goals and projects a reality.
- Homeless shelters and Assistance Centers; EMT/Fire/Police Safety Classes/Centers; Red Cross, Cancer, and other
 charities; animal shelters; fundraisers to benefit the public or community members in need; adopt a highway;
 Town/City/open areas/community gardens; food shelves and pantries.

WHAT steps should an Auxiliary take to have a successful Outreach Program:

- Partner with non- profit, civic and other organizations that support residents, animals, and the environment.
- Have a MOTION APPROVED AND RECORDED IN THE MINUTES prior to partnering and volunteering TIME.
- At least one (1) member of any age or skill set must volunteer TIME with the other approved organizations.
- Members must WEAR VFW AUXILIARY ATTIRE (shirt, hat, name badge, lanyard, etc.) when volunteering TIME.
- Volunteers should share information about membership eligibility, and Auxiliary programs.

WHEN can members establish partnerships, request Auxiliary approval and volunteer TIME?

- Partnerships can be for single events or for multiple on-coming needs.
- Partnerships need to be approved and recorded PRIOR TO THE EVENTS EACH AUXILIARY YEAR.
- Partnerships/volunteer TIME need to be reported to the Department Chairman to ensure Auxiliary credit.
- Year-end reports must be received by March 31st, 2025, to be eligible for Department and National awards.

WHERE can members volunteer TIME and show their community support?

- Auxiliary members should volunteer TIME with organizations that serves to benefit and improve the community.
- Cook, serve food/drinks, or deliver food to shut-ins; make beds and do laundry at homeless shelters.
- Feed, walk dogs, and clean animal cages; clean, paint, and repair inside/outside community facilities.

- Upkeep public parks & walkways; plant trees and flowers in open areas.
- Read or write letters, teach computer skills to seniors; be a personal shopper for shut ins.
- Register donors at Blood Drives; register and/or time participants and/or provide water to walkers at fund raisers.

WHY should an Auxiliary "reach out" to other organizations and establish partnerships?

- VFW and VFW Auxiliary members being visible in their Auxiliary attire is a win/win.
- Partners benefit from the years of knowledge and experience that volunteers apply to the project.
- Sharing time in the community residents gives Auxiliary members the opportunity to educate the community about the VFW Auxiliary, its programs, goals, and membership eligibility for membership.
- Auxiliary members meet new people, learn new skills, and develop personal confidence.

HOW does an Auxiliary get credit for its partnerships and volunteer TIME?

- Auxiliary Program Chairman report partnership details, volunteer attire and TIME to the Department Chairman by email, USPS, or phone call. Donations, monetary, gift cards or goods, are not reportable.
- Activities that benefit the VFW, the VFW Auxiliary and/or the Post Home do not qualify for credit.
- Activities that are reportable under other VFW Auxiliary programs, do not qualify for credit.
- Auxiliary members are helpers and are NEVER in charge of events and activities for Outreach credit.

DEPARTMENT AWARDS FOR AUXILIARIES

- All Auxiliaries, who report approved partnerships and volunteer TIME by September 30, 2024, will be entered into a drawing for twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) at Fall Conference.
- All Auxiliaries who report approved partnerships and volunteer TIME to the Chairman by December 31, 2024, will be entered into a drawing for twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) at Spring Conference.

The sixth President of the United States, John Quincy Adams, said ... "If your actions inspire others to dream more, learn more, do more and become more, you are a leader." These inspirational words of wisdom are instrumental for each of us to strive to be a good leader, an active listener and to keep our thoughts open to new ideas in order to achieve the goals that are set forth by our National organization.

As a team, we will all work together to achieve the four goals that have been established by the National Chief of Staff for 2024-2025:

- Goal # 1 Maintain and Strengthen Current Auxiliaries
- Goal # 2 Present to Unaffiliated Posts
- Goal #3 Establish New Auxiliaries
- Goal #4 Recognize Red-Flag Auxiliaries

MAINTAIN AND STRENGTHEN CURRENT AUXILIARIES The National Organization has developed many resources for members to use. These resources are found on the VFW Auxiliary National Website behind the MALTA login *Member Resources*.

One resource is the **Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit**. The Healthy Auxiliary Took Kit includes seven (7) tools designed to assist Auxiliaries and to help them identify and solve issues that may arise:

- Auxiliary Meeting Checklist for the Aux President Healthy Auxiliary Checklist To-Do's and Deadlines
- Healthy Communication Phone/Text Tree VFW Auxiliary Healthy Certificate
- VFW Auxiliary Meeting Challenges & Solutions VFW Auxiliary Member Questionnaire
- VFW Auxiliary Sample Meeting Agenda

Building on the VFW Auxiliary Foundation is a guidebook that provides valuable information to help educate members about all aspects of the duties of all Officers [on all levels]. The guidebook outlines the duties and responsibilities of program chairmen. It explains why reporting is important and much more!

What is Extension & Revitalization? Extension pertains to contacting Unaffiliated Posts for their interest to institute a new Auxiliary. Revitalization refers to ensuring that our current Auxiliaries continue to be healthy by providing learning experiences for all members. Conversely, for auxiliaries requiring some assistance, the program will extend a helpful hand to the auxiliary to regain its strength to being healthy. Our Department has many legacy members who are willing to share their knowledge and provide assistance to auxiliaries in distress.

What benefits does the Extension & Revitalization Program provide? The Extension & Revitalization Program will benefit every member of the Auxiliary. Benefits to all members include being more informed about the organization and gaining knowledge of our Auxiliary traditions and programs designed to assist in mentoring our members for future leadership roles.

What are the 5 essentials of an Auxiliary?

- 1. Auxiliaries should have a minimum of 10 business meetings per year (Sec. 210A) with a quorum of 5 members in good standing attending for the transaction of business (Sec. 212A).
- 2. Membership dues should be paid by at least 10 members on or before February 1st of the current year. (Sec 207C)
- 3. Quarterly audits completed by Trustees must be submitted to the Department Treasurer (Sec. 814).
- 4. Officers elected, installed and reported to National Headquarters by June 30th. This generates the bond application via email (Sec 804A and 806A).
- 5. The offices of President and Treasurer must be bonded by August 31 (Sec. 814E).

Contacting Unaffiliated Posts and Establishment of New Auxiliaries can be achieved through communication, promotions and presentations. We must show Unaffiliated Posts how they can benefit from having a VFW Auxiliary. We can then help them establish a new Auxiliary for their Post. Several tools are available to share with Unaffiliated VFW Posts. "Top Ten Reasons for Your Post to Have an Auxiliary" is great handout to use when meeting Post members. A PowerPoint presentation "Why Having an Auxiliary Can Boost Your Post" is designed to show Post members how helpful the Auxiliary and its contributions are. Another valuable tool to have on hand when making presentations is the VFW Auxiliary Eligibility Wheel.

We continue to accomplish growth within our Department by actively extending ourselves to show how an Auxiliary is an asset to the Post. We demonstrate how we fulfill the mission of our organization by working together as a family to serve our veterans, our active-duty service personnel and their families.

<u>Recognizing Yellow-Flag Auxiliaries</u> – Auxiliaries are exhibiting Red Flag and caution light situations. The Department Chief of Staff, upon request of the Department President, will assist the Auxiliary to return to a posture of a Green Light Auxiliary. Green light Auxiliaries are considered healthy.

<u>Recognizing Red-Flag Auxiliaries</u> – The Auxiliary will be placed on Suspension which is a time for the Auxiliary to step back and regroup. Suspension simply means there is some work to do to get the Auxiliary where it needs to be with the hope for the Auxiliary to come back stronger and better than before.

<u>Mentoring for Leadership</u> – In the VFW Auxiliary, mentoring is an important part of maintaining the health and viability of each Auxiliary and for the organization as a whole.

<u>What is the purpose of mentoring</u>? The purpose of mentoring is to facilitate the personal and professional growth of individuals by providing guidance, support and knowledge transferred from experienced mentors to mentees.

Utilizing the "Mentoring at VFW Auxiliary: Relationship Building for the Future" document will help you get started in creating a program for your Auxiliary. Through the Mentoring for Leadership Program, all mentors will be encouraged to embrace and promote the **C.A.R.E.** concept.

- C ... Catch the member when they first join.
- A ... Ask them to participate.
- R ... Remember what it felt like to be new.
- E ... Engage them in a program that fits them.

As a mentor, you will also be asked to practice the 3 C's of Mentoring:

- **Consultant** that is the most obvious role of the mentor.
- Counselor listen to your mentees.
- Cheerleader give constructive feedback, advise, provide support and enthusiasm.

<u>Be Informed</u> – There is something else you can do to grow and become more involved. You need to learn all you can with the resources available to you.

- 1. Obtain a copy of the National Bylaws and read it in its entirety. Your rights and responsibilities as a member of this organization are contained in that document. You need to know them!
- 2. Be sure you read all communications received from Auxiliary, District, Department and National levels.
- 3. Do you receive the E-Newsletter from the National Office? Go to National website Home page -> Media -> E-Newsletter Signup
- 4. Log on to the Auxiliary website and Facebook pages often. You will want to stay up-to-date on news and information, www.vfwauxiliary.org

Back by Popular Demand! Communication and training are important to achieve success. The Chief of Staff will host monthly **"Zoom Training Sessions"**. All members are encouraged to attend. Each month, beginning in September, a different VFW Auxiliary topic will be featured along with an agenda of the scheduled training. The **"Zoom Training Session"** will last approximately 30 minutes. Time will be allotted for questions and answers. After each **"Zoom Training Session"**, the information will be included in the next *Auxiliary News* and posted on the Department Facebook page and Department website. A Zoom Training schedule will be posted on the Department Website with dates and times. We hope you will be able to attend.

<u>Communication works hand in hand with Recognition</u>. A simple "thank you" for a job well done is always appreciated. The "Good Job Award" certificate is available for download at the National website. This certificate allows us to show how much we appreciate our members. Always welcome members at your meetings and events with a spirit of compassion, kindness and empathy.

VFW Auxiliary members have been volunteering in hospitals and medical faciliaties since the organization's inception in 1914. The Hospital Program was one of the first nationally adopted for the organization. Hospital volunteers have been putting smiles on veteran's faces for well over a hundred years, but there is more to the Program; it is about the veteran. This year we are going back to the basics, we are going to be their little ray of sunshine. We know what the veteran has done for us, now it is our turn to do for the veteran.

We are the ones who bridge the gap between the family and the veterans. We share of ourselves. Imagine going into their room with a smile and a cheerful "Hello". Before long, you will see a grin on their face. Not eveyone can visit a veteran center, but you can participate by making things and sending them to the health facility. Get in touch with your activity director to find out what is needed.

<u>Where can we serve?</u> Members, non-members, and youth can volunteer in many different types of facilities under this program. Local hospitals, Veterans' homes, Nursing homes, Domicilairies both VA and non-VA medical facilities and clinics.

Who can serve? Members, Non-members, Youth and Families.

<u>What can we do?</u> Volunteer oppportunities are based on the facility. Some facilities will have a volunteer program in place with specific jobs, events and needs. They will have opportunities to suit different ages and abilities. Be sure you follow guidelines of the facility, and ask how you can assist them.

<u>What can we earn?</u> Members can earn Hospital Volunteer Service Pins from National for their hours. Chairmen should track total hours (both VA and non-VA) and submit an application for pins. More information along with forms can be obtained from the Department Chairman or in MALTA Member Resources. Members can also be named an Outstanding Hospital Volunteer of the Year in their Program Division. Applications are available from the Department Chairman. Non-members can also earn a one-time volunteer pin for 100 hours.

<u>Volunteer Recruitment, Recognition and Support</u> – New volunteers are needed everyday across the country. Volunteers offset millions of dollars in expenses in health care. A few tips for recruiting and keeping volunteers: Monthly sign up sheet for regular events at your meeting, emails and phone calls for special events, and public recognition for current volunteers. Find out how each person best communicates, whether by phone, email, Facebook or texting. If someone says "No" to the first invitation, be sure to ask again!

Recruiting both member and non-member community volunteers and engaging them in the work of the Hospital Program is integral to its success. In most medical facilities, an extra hand can help lighten the load for staff and is greatly appreciated. Hospitals and nursing homes are in almost every community and often include veteran residents who do not have spouses or close relatives to assist them.

Mental Health Awareness and Suicide Awareness

Discover and use the 10 Steps of Mindfulness Mediation. Contact Veterans Affairs Hospital for information on their Community Outreach/Suicide Awareness program for assistance.

At our Fall Conference, we will be working closely with the VFW to do another "Stop 22" Walk. "Stop 22" gets its name from the suicide rate among veterans that has again risen to 22 lost per day. Help "Stop that 22!" Walk with us. Create your own "Stop 22" event in your own community. Walk, sit, play baseball, or whatever activity you choose for 22 minutes. Exercise and educate your community on the resources available to help our veterans.

<u>The Veterans Crisis Line</u> connects Veterans in crisis <u>and</u> their families and friends with qualified, caring Department of Veterans Affairs responders through a confidential toll-free hotline, online chat or text. Support is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Educate all on the **Crisis Line – Call 988, press 1**.

As part of Mental Health this year, we will be focusing on the mental health of our military serving overseas by assuring that their children at home are receiving excellent childcare. New York State is the first state to provide the Military Child Care in Your Neighborhood (MCCYN-PLUS) offered by the DoD. 48,000 eligible military families are now able to choose from 15,000 state-licensed childcare providers to receive childcare assistance.

<u>Holiday Cheer/"Trees for Troops"-</u> Again this year, we will be working with the Department's VFW to send trees, decorations and menorahs to our troops serving overseas. Trees are \$25.00 each. Donate on the form included in your President's Packet. All donations are due by <u>November 10</u>, <u>2024</u>.

<u>"In Lieu of Cards"-</u> A specially designed card will accompany trees, menorahs and decorations to troops overseas in time for the holidays. The card will be available for signatures at OTI, Fall conference. Donate \$5/member to sign the card Form in your President's Packet. All donations are due by *November 10*, 2024.



National Veterans Service (NVS) This program helps Veterans, service members and their families obtain the benefits they deserve – at no cost. NVS provides a nationwide network of nearly 300 VFW Service Officers who help veterans and their family members navigate the Veterans Affairs system. Examples of claims and resources provided are: • Disability compensation, • Rehabilitation and educational programs, • Pension and death benefits and • Employment and training programs.

Support NVS by making a contribution on the Department of New York Donation Report Form found in our 2024-2025 Program Guidebook.

<u>VFW Veterans and Military Support Program (VMS)</u> Initiated by the VFW, this program serves active-duty and recently discharged military. The three components include: Military Assistance Program (MAP), Unmet Needs and VFW "Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship." Support VFW Veterans and Military Support on the <u>Donation Report Form</u> in our 2024-2025 Program Guidebook.

Military Assistance Program (MAP) This program helps forge and nurture bonds with military units by providing financial assistance for Posts, Districts and Departments to sponsor morale-boosting send-offs, homecomings, and casual get-togethers. It offers ways to connect with troops. Posts and Auxiliaries participating in *Adopt-a-Unit* and *Family Readiness Group* events can receive assistance. Grants of up to \$1,500, payable directly to a creditor, can bridge the gap to cover these bills. To learn more visit vfw.org/assistance/financial grants.

<u>"Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship"</u> Up to \$5,000 is awarded to qualifying veterans and service members to help them complete their educational goals, without incurring excessive student loan debt. To learn more, visit vfw.org/student-veterans-support.

VFW Auxiliary is in a unique position to help teach our youth the skills to become responsible adults through serving our country, communities, and veterans. Today's youth are the future of our nation. They are our future leaders of tomorrow. So how do we get them involved and teach them about our great organizations? We can take the lead in this endeavor if we commit ourselves to teaching them and guiding them in the right direction. Get out in our community and reach youth groups, then engage them in activities that give back to our veterans, their families, and community. Teach them to respect and take responsibility for their country.

Patriotism Through Literacy

One of the easiest ways to promote patriotism is through reading. It is often taken for granted the many freedoms we enjoy, that our forefathers fought so hard to defend. We need to educate our youth at an early age about the historical figures that helped built this great country, the United States of America. Ways you can participate: Donate historical fiction or non-fiction books to your local school, library, or shelter, volunteer to read to youth at a school or library, host a read-a-thon and award prizes for the number of books read. Prizes might include books, bookmarks, or stickers. Go to MALTA Members Resources, under Youth Activities, and under 'Patriotism through Literacy' there are lists that are divided by grade levels.

Youth Reading to our Veterans & Veterans Reading to Youth:

Reading is a big part of growing up and learning. Many students have nightly reading as homework starting at an early age. Sometimes just talking to the students about patriotism, America and our country can be dull. But taking the students on a journey in a book might capture their attention more and open their mind. For example, the little ones can view images of what Frances Scott Key saw as he wrote the "Star-Spangled Banner." The Youth Group Supporting Our Veterans Citation is one way for Auxiliaries to recognize youth groups for their efforts and service projects honoring our veterans and assisting service members and their families.

Christmas Toy Drive:

Auxiliaries are asked to participate in the Christmas Toy Drive for the children in our communities. The drive should run from November 1st - December 1st, 2024. Please bring an unwrapped toy to your District meeting by December 1st. The District President will donate the toys to an organization in your area. Suggestions of agencies: Boys & Girls Club, Daycare Centers, or Church Youth Groups.

Placemats projects:

This is an easy program. Auxiliaries can purchase paper placemats to work with children in local youth groups. Have them decorate the placemats for VA hospital, nursing home or senior center lunch program.

Illustrating America

This is a two-dimensional art contest that is open to any student in grades K-8 who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial school, or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Entries will be judged on patriotic theme and technique and consist of three grade divisions: K-2, 3-5, and 6-8. Entries must be received at the participating Auxiliary by March 31st, Department by April 15th, and National by May 5th. The entry form with all requirements and contest rules can be found in MALTA. **In each division winners will receive:**

First Place: \$25 Second Place: \$15 Third Place \$10

Sponsoring and Working with Youth Groups

An Auxiliary can sponsor a youth group and engage youth in all our programs. Teach them about Auxiliary efforts to respect and take pride in our country. They can visit and volunteer in VA and non-VA hospitals and/or facilities, raise funds for a community veterans memorial, march in patriotic holiday parades, volunteer to help veterans and active-duty military families with yard work or household chores, send cards or small gifts to the National Home to show support for the families, make cards or write letters in the classroom to mail to our troops overseas or hospitalized veterans, or teach veterans and their families computer skills.

Youth groups should be recognized for their efforts and service projects that honor our veterans and assist active-duty military personnel and their families. Let your community leaders, teachers, coaches, school clubs, and others know what we have to offer our youth and how we will recognize their efforts. Supporting Our Veterans National Citation and the Patriotic Youth Award are available in MALTA.

Most Outstanding Activity and/or Event: National Award

Youth reading to veterans and/or veterans reading to youth. A citation will be awarded to every Auxiliary that hosts an activity and/or event who submits an entry form, which can be found on MALTA, and received by the Department Chairman by March 31st for judging. All entries will be sent to National who will mail the citations to the Auxiliaries. One Auxiliary in each of the four Conferences will receive a citation and \$25 for the most outstanding activity/event.

Make Your Auxiliary Accessible to Today's Youth

Communicating our causes and events to the world has never been easier. The youth of today are tweeting on Twitter, posting on Facebook, sending pictures on Instagram, and subscribing to YouTube channels. The collaborative elements of social media allow our youth the ability to view and comment on each other's activities. Use these resources to get the word out about how they can get involved in our cause.

Random Acts of Patriotism (R.A.P.)

Children like to be told they are doing a wonderful job. Praising a child can go a long way and it helps boost their confidence. Create a reward system for the cards, each card has so many points. The points can help them win a book, or other prizes. R.A.P. have cards available to present to a youth who demonstrates a random act of patriotism. The card can be downloaded from MALTA for free and printed on cardstock.

- * Do NOT send any other supporting documents, as it will not be considered.
